AN ACT

1	Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled
2	"An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the
3	executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the
4	Executive Department thereof and the administrative
5	departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof,
б	including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or
7	Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or
8	authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative
9	departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and
10	duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative
11	officers, and of the several administrative departments,
12	boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the
13	Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive
14	and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of
15	certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and
16	other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards,
17	and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the
18	number and compensation of the deputies and all other
19	assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and
20	commissions shall be determined, " further providing for
21	parks.
22	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
23	hereby enacts as follows:

24	Section 1. Section 1906-A of the act of April 9, 1929
25	(P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, is
26	amended by adding a clause to read:
27	Section 1906-A. ParksThe Department of Environmental

Resources shall have the power, and its duty shall be: 1 2 * * * 3 (12) To designate overnight areas for pets within State 4 parks: 5 (a) The following acts are prohibited by pet owners using park facilities: 6 7 (i) Possessing a pet in a public building, public transportation vehicle, swimming beach or any structure or area 8 9 closed to the possession of pets by the department. This 10 subclause shall not apply to quide dogs accompanying persons 11 having visual impairment or hearing ear dogs accompanying persons having hearing impairment. 12 13 (ii) Failing to crate, cage, restrain on a leash, which 14 shall not exceed six feet in length, or otherwise physically 15 confine a pet at all times. 16 (iii) Leaving a pet unattended and tied to an object, except 17 in designated areas or under conditions established by the 18 department. 19 (iv) Allowing a pet to make noise that is unreasonable 20 considering location, time of day or night, impact on park users and other relevant factors, or that frightens wildlife by 21 22 barking, howling or making other noise. 23 (v) Failing to comply with pet excrement disposal conditions 24 established by the department. 25 (b) In park areas where hunting is allowed, dogs may be used 26 in support of hunting activities in accordance with applicable 27 Federal and State laws and in accordance with conditions 28 established by the department. (c) Pets or feral animals that are running at large and 29 observed by an authorized person in the act of killing, injuring 30

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1 or molesting humans, livestock or wildlife may be destroyed if

2 necessary for public safety or protection of wildlife, livestock

3 <u>or other park resources.</u>

4 (d) Subclauses (a) through (c) do not apply to dogs used by

5 <u>authorized Federal, State and local law enforcement officers in</u>

- 6 the performance of their official duties.
- 7 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
