AN ACT

Amending the act of December 7, 1982 (P.L.784, No.225), entitled 1 "An act relating to dogs, regulating the keeping of dogs; 2 3 providing for the licensing of dogs and kennels; providing 4 for the protection of dogs and the detention and destruction 5 of dogs in certain cases; regulating the sale and transportation of dogs; declaring dogs to be personal 6 7 property and the subject of theft; providing for the 8 assessment of damages done to livestock, poultry and domestic 9 game birds; providing for payment of damages by the Commonwealth in certain cases and the liability of the owner 10 or keeper of dogs for such damages; imposing powers and 11 12 duties on certain State and local officers and employees; 13 providing penalties; and creating a Dog Law Restricted 14 Account, " further providing for annual reports.

15 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

16 hereby enacts as follows:

17 Section 1. The act of December 7, 1982 (P.L.784, No.225),

- 18 known as the Dog Law, is amended by adding a section to read:
- 19 Section 906. Reports to the General Assembly.
- 20 (a) Annual report. -- On or before March 1 of each year, the
- 21 <u>Secretary of Agriculture shall provide a report to the</u>

1	Agriculture and Rural Affairs Committee of the Senate and the	
2	Agriculture and Rural Affairs Committee of the House of	
3	Representatives which shall describe all relevant activities of	
4	the department for the preceding calendar year pursuant to this	
5	act. The report shall contain, at a minimum, the following:	
6	(1) The number of State dog wardens by county.	
7	(2) The number of dog licenses issued by county.	
8	(3) The number of kennel licenses issued in each kennel	
9	class by county.	
10	(4) The number of out-of-State kennel licenses issued by	
11	the department.	
12	(5) The total moneys collected from license fees, fines	
13	and penalties.	
14	(6) A summary of dog law enforcement activity by region,	
15	which shall include the total number of kennel inspections	
16	performed by kennel class; the number of dogs kept at each	
17	inspected kennel; and the county of location.	
18	(7) The number of kennel licenses, including out-of-	
19	State kennel licenses, refused, revoked or suspended and the	
20	reasons for such refusals, revocations and suspensions.	
21	(8) The number of citations issued by county and the	
22	disposition of each citation.	
23	(9) The number of dogs seized and detained and the	
24	disposition of such dogs.	
25	(10) The total payments made by the department from the	
26	Dog Law Restricted Account and the reasons for such payments.	
27	(11) Recommendations to improve the administration and	
28	enforcement of this act when applicable.	
29	(c) Additional reportOn or before June 30, 1995, the	
30	Secretary of Agriculture shall submit a report to the	
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1	Agriculture and Rural Affairs Committee of the Senate and the
2	Agriculture and Rural Affairs Committee of the House of
3	Representatives which shall contain the following:
4	(1) A summary of the internal accounting controls
5	implemented to assure that no payroll expenditures other than
6	those related to the administration of this act are charged
7	to the Dog Law Restricted Account.
8	(2) A summary of the procedures implemented to monitor
9	the monthly activity reports of State dog wardens to assure
10	that such reports accurately reflect work which has been
11	performed and that there is appropriate supporting
12	documentation for the reports.
13	(3) A summary of the inspection of county or humane
14	organization dog control facilities which received State
15	money under the grant program established pursuant to section
16	1002 to assure that such facilities are in compliance with
17	all guidelines, conditions or applicable regulations of the
18	department regarding the usage of such money and with any
19	other requirements of the grant program.
20	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
