AN ACT

- Placing a moratorium on the construction of contaminated waste incinerators; and establishing a commission to study the effects of contaminated waste incinerators on the public health, environment and the economy of this Commonwealth.
- 5 The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:
- 6 (1) That incineration is a waste-processing method that
 7 should only be utilized when there are no other alternatives
 8 for the disposal of hazardous waste.
- 9 (2) That the current underground storage tank closure 10 requirements and a moving trend toward industrial site 11 remediation activity will result in greater amounts of 12 contaminated soil and material needing proper disposal 13 methods.
- 14 (3) That the Commonwealth and its agents should examine
 15 and consider other methods of hazardous waste disposal such
 16 as, but not limited to, bio-remediation or land farming,
- 17 before granting future incinerator permits.

- 1 (4) That the possible effects of hazardous waste
- 2 incineration on public health, the environment and the
- 3 economy have not been adequately addressed and no conclusive
- 4 and convincing evidence has been set forth.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Short title.
- 8 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Hazardous
- 9 Waste Incinerator Moratorium Act.
- 10 Section 2. Definitions.
- 11 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 12 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 13 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 14 "Commission." The Commission on Hazardous Waste Incinerators
- 15 established in section 4.
- 16 "Department." The Department of Environmental Resources of
- 17 the Commonwealth.
- 18 "Hazardous waste." As defined in section 103 of the act of
- 19 July 7, 1980 (P.L.380, No.97), known as the Solid Waste
- 20 Management Act.
- 21 "Hazardous waste incinerator." An enclosed device using
- 22 controlled flame combustion, the primary purpose of which is to
- 23 thermally break down and purify hazardous waste.
- 24 "Secretary." The Secretary of Environmental Resources of the
- 25 Commonwealth.
- 26 Section 3. Moratorium on construction of hazardous waste
- incinerators.
- 28 The department is directed to cease immediately the review
- 29 and issuance of permits for newly proposed hazardous waste
- 30 incinerators for a period of 18 months.

- 1 Section 4. Commission on Hazardous Waste Incinerators.
- 2 (a) Establishment.--There is hereby created a 13-member
- 3 Commission on Hazardous Waste Incinerators for the purpose of
- 4 assisting the department in providing technical and scientific
- 5 advice as needed to implement the provisions of this act.
- 6 (b) Membership.--Five members shall be appointed by the
- 7 secretary and two members each by the President pro tempore of
- 8 the Senate, the Minority Leader of the Senate, the Speaker of
- 9 the House of Representatives and the Minority Leader of the
- 10 House of Representatives. Members shall have background in and
- 11 be practicing in engineering, statistics, chemistry, toxicology
- 12 or other related scientific education or have experience that
- 13 relates to problems and issues applicable to the use of
- 14 hazardous waste incinerators. The board membership shall include
- 15 representatives of local government, the public, the regulated
- 16 community and the academic field.
- 17 (c) Terms.--The members of the commission shall serve three-
- 18 year terms.
- 19 (d) Expenses.--Members of the board shall be reimbursed for
- 20 their travel expenses and any other reasonable expenses incurred
- 21 in the performance of their duties as members of the commission.
- 22 (e) Support.--The department shall provide the appropriate
- 23 administrative and technical support needed by the commission in
- 24 order to accomplish its purpose, including support for surveys
- 25 or technical studies that the commission may consider necessary
- 26 to undertake. The department shall publish a notice of meeting
- 27 dates, times and locations and an agenda for the meeting no less
- 28 than 14 days prior to the meeting. These notices shall be
- 29 published in a manner as required by the act of July 3, 1986
- 30 (P.L.388, No.84), known as the Sunshine Act.

- 1 Section 5. Powers and duties.
- 2 The powers and duties of the commission are as follows:
- 3 (1) To study and evaluate the present methods of
- 4 hazardous waste incineration and possible alternatives.
- 5 (2) To study and evaluate the effects, if any, of
- 6 hazardous waste incineration on human health, the environment
- 7 and the economy.
- 8 (3) To study and evaluate current safety standards and
- 9 propose additional standards if necessary.
- 10 (4) To report its findings and recommendations to the
- 11 Governor, the General Assembly and the department in such a
- time frame so as to coincide with the end of the moratorium
- on the issuance of permits by the department.
- 14 Section 6. Effective date.
- 15 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
