AN ACT

- 1 Establishing the State Fire Commission, the Office of State Fire
 2 Commissioner, the Fire Operations Policy Committee, the Fire
 3 Training Policy Committee, the Hazardous Materials Planning
 4 and Response Policy Committee, the Fire Investigation Policy
 5 Committee, the Volunteer Loan Assistance Program Policy
 6 Committee and the Public Education Policy Committee and
 7 providing for their duties and responsibilities; transferring
 8 jurisdiction of hazardous materials and forest fire
 9 prevention and operational control of the Fire Marshal's
 10 Office to the State Fire Commission; and making a repeal.
- 11 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 12 hereby enacts as follows:
- 13 Section 1. Short title.
- 14 This act shall be known and may be cited as the State Fire
- 15 Commission Act.
- 16 Section 2. Definitions.

- 1 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 2 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 3 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 4 "Commission." The State Fire Commission established under
- 5 section 3.
- 6 "Commissioner." The State Fire Commissioner appointed under
- 7 section 4.
- 8 "Education committee." The Public Education Policy Committee
- 9 established under section 10.
- 10 "Hazardous materials committee." The Hazardous Materials
- 11 Planning and Response Policy Committee established under section
- 12 7.
- "Investigation committee." The Fire Investigation Policy
- 14 Committee established under section 8.
- 15 "Loan committee." The Volunteer Loan Assistance Program
- 16 Policy Committee established under section 9.
- 17 "Operations committee." The Fire Operations Policy Committee
- 18 established under section 5.
- 19 "PEMA." The Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency.
- 20 "Training committee." The Fire Training Policy Committee
- 21 established under section 6.
- 22 Section 3. State Fire Commission.
- 23 (a) Establishment.--To assure prompt, proper and effective
- 24 discharge of Commonwealth responsibility relating to fire
- 25 safety, fire investigation, fire prevention, fire control and
- 26 public fire education, the State Fire Commission is hereby
- 27 established as an independent agency.
- 28 (b) Responsibility.--The commission shall have primary
- 29 responsibility for overall policy and direction of Statewide
- 30 fire safety, fire prevention and fire control efforts.

- 1 (c) Membership.--The commission shall be composed of 16
- 2 members, as follows:
- 3 (1) The Governor, or a designee.
- 4 (2) The Lieutenant Governor, or a designee.
- 5 (3) The President pro tempore of the Senate, or a
- 6 designee.
- 7 (4) The Speaker of the House of Representatives, or a
- 8 designee.
- 9 (5) The Minority Leader of the Senate, or a designee.
- 10 (6) The Minority Leader of the House of Representatives
- 11 or a designee.
- 12 (7) A member of the public at large.
- 13 (8) The president of the Pennsylvania Hazardous
- 14 Materials Association.
- 15 (9) The president of the Firemen's Association State of
- 16 Pennsylvania.
- 17 (10) The president of the Keystone Fire Chiefs
- 18 Association.
- 19 (11) The director of the Emergency Medical Services
- 20 Division of the Department of Health.
- 21 (12) The president of the Pennsylvania Association of
- 22 Arson Investigators.
- 23 (13) The president of the Keystone Chapter Fire Service
- 24 Instructors.
- 25 (14) The president of the Pennsylvania Fire Training
- 26 Agencies.
- 27 (15) The president of the Pennsylvania Professional
- 28 Firefighters Association.
- 29 (d) Chairperson. -- The Governor shall chair the commission.
- 30 If the Governor is unable or chooses not to chair the

- 1 commission, the commission members may by majority vote elect a
- 2 chairperson from the remaining members.
- 3 (e) Quorum.--Eight members of the commission shall
- 4 constitute a quorum.
- 5 (f) Compensation and expenses. -- The members shall serve
- 6 without compensation but may be reimbursed for their actual and
- 7 necessary traveling and other expenses incurred in connection
- 8 with attendance at meetings.
- 9 (g) Initial appointments.--Initial appointments to the
- 10 commission, excluding the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor and
- 11 members of the General Assembly, shall be staggered so that at
- 12 least two but no more than three terms expire during the same
- 13 year.
- 14 (h) Vacancies.--Vacancies shall be filled by the appointing
- 15 authority. Individuals appointed to fill vacancies shall serve
- 16 the unexpired term of the original appointee.
- 17 (i) Removal.--Members of the commission may be removed by
- 18 their appointing authority for just cause, which shall include
- 19 neglect of official duties, impropriety associated with official
- 20 duties or termination of membership in the organization
- 21 represented.
- 22 (j) Regular meetings.--For the conduct of routine business,
- 23 including, particularly, the consideration of matters of basic
- 24 policy, the commission shall meet at least three times during
- 25 each calendar year and at the call of the chair.
- 26 (k) Staff.--The commission shall, within the limitations of
- 27 appropriations made to the commission, arrange for the
- 28 employment of such professional, technical, administrative and
- 29 other staff as may be deemed essential to the development and
- 30 maintenance of a Statewide fire prevention and control program.

- 1 All such personnel shall be employed under and be subject to
- 2 pertinent provisions of the act of August 5, 1941 (P.L.752,
- 3 No.286), known as the Civil Service Act, and the Commonwealth
- 4 Compensation Plan.
- 5 (1) Office space, equipment and services.--The commission
- 6 shall be furnished necessary and appropriate office space,
- 7 furniture, equipment, supplies and services in the same manner
- 8 as are other Commonwealth departments and agencies.
- 9 (m) Powers and duties. -- The commission shall have the
- 10 following powers and duties:
- 11 (1) To prepare, maintain and keep current a fire
- 12 prevention and control program. The plan may include
- 13 provisions for:
- 14 (i) identification of areas particularly vulnerable
- to fire disasters; and
- 16 (ii) recommendations for zoning, building and other
- land use controls; safety measures pertaining to
- nonpermanent or semipermanent structures; resources
- 19 conservation and allocation; and other preventive and
- 20 preparedness measures designed to eliminate or reduce
- 21 fire disasters or their impact.
- 22 (2) To promulgate, adopt and enforce such rules,
- 23 regulations and orders as shall be necessary to carry out the
- 24 provisions of this act.
- 25 (3) To provide technical advice and assistance to
- 26 Commonwealth agencies and political subdivisions in the
- 27 preparation of fire prevention and control programs or
- 28 components thereof and to periodically review such programs
- and suggest or require revisions.
- 30 (4) To establish and operate or assist political

- subdivisions in establishing and operating training programs and programs of public information.
- 3 (5) To supply appropriate Commonwealth and local
 4 agencies and officials and the general public with
 5 precautionary notices, watches and warnings relating to
 6 actual and potential fire problems and to provide a flow of
 7 official information and instructions to the general public
 8 through all means available before, during and after an
 9 emergency.
 - (6) To make or request of the Commonwealth or local agencies and officials studies, surveys and reports as are necessary to carry out the purposes of this act.

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- (7) To plan and make arrangements for the availability and use of any private facilities, services and property and, if necessary and if in fact used, provide for payment for use under terms and conditions agreed upon.
- (8) To cooperate with the Federal Government and any public or private entity in achieving any purpose of this act and in implementing programs for fire prevention, control, preparation, response and recovery.
- (9) To administer grant programs to political subdivisions for fire prevention and control.
- 23 (10) To take other action necessary, incidental or 24 appropriate for the implementation of this act.
- 25 (11) To report annually to the General Assembly on the 26 state of the Commonwealth's fire prevention and control 27 programs and on significant events occurring within the past 28 year.
- 29 (12) To recommend to the Governor legislation or other 30 actions as deemed necessary in connection with the purposes 19950H1085B1208 - 6 -

- 1 of this section.
- 2 (13) To provide from its own stockpiles or other sources
- 3 emergency equipment, materials and supplies required and
- 4 available for essential supplementation of those owned,
- 5 acquired and used by Commonwealth, county and local
- 6 departments and agencies for fire prevention and control.
- 7 (14) For a period of 30 days after an emergency is
- 8 declared by the Governor, to incur obligations for or
- 9 purchase such materials and supplies as may be necessary to
- 10 combat a fire disaster, protect the health and safety of
- 11 persons and property and provide emergency assistance to
- victims of a fire disaster without complying with formal
- 13 bidding or other time-consuming contract procedures.
- 14 (15) To cooperate with the policy committees established
- under this act in order to insure an effective implementation
- and furtherance of the provisions contained in this act.
- 17 (16) To receive and act upon policy recommendations
- 18 received from the committees established under this act.
- 19 (n) Administrative provisions. -- Except as otherwise provided
- 20 in this section, the commission shall be subject to the
- 21 provisions of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known
- 22 as The Administrative Code of 1929.
- 23 (o) Utilization of existing services and facilities.--In
- 24 order to avoid duplication of services and facilities, the
- 25 commission shall utilize the services and facilities of existing
- 26 officers, offices, departments, commissions, boards, bureaus,
- 27 institutions and other agencies of the Commonwealth and of its
- 28 political subdivisions. These officers and agencies shall
- 29 cooperate with and extend their services and facilities to the
- 30 commission as requested.

- 1 Section 4. State Fire Commissioner.
- 2 (a) Appointment and qualifications. -- The Governor shall
- 3 appoint a full-time State Fire Commissioner to supervise the
- 4 work of the commission. The commissioner shall be a person who,
- 5 by reason of training, expertise, experience and attainment, is
- 6 qualified to coordinate fire safety, fire prevention and fire
- 7 control activities.
- 8 (b) Removal.--The commissioner shall be subject to removal
- 9 by the Governor for just cause.
- 10 (c) Powers and duties. -- The commissioner shall perform all
- 11 fiscal, planning, administrative, operational and other duties
- 12 as may be assigned to him by the commission, shall sit on the
- 13 PEMA Council to coordinate the commission's activities with the
- 14 PEMA Council and shall be an ex-officio member of all
- 15 established committees. The commissioner shall also have the
- 16 following powers and duties:
- 17 (1) To coordinate the activities of the commission and
- 18 State and local community interests engaged in fire safety,
- 19 fire investigation, fire prevention, fire control and public
- 20 fire education.
- 21 (2) To serve as a focal point for information relative
- 22 to fires, property damage, injuries and the loss of life.
- 23 (3) To disseminate, through periodic reports,
- 24 information about fire safety, fire prevention efforts and
- 25 fire control techniques.
- 26 (4) To develop and participate in a program of public
- 27 information and education designed to create a public
- awareness of the incidence and the ravages of fire and
- 29 methods the individual can take to prevent fires and to
- 30 minimize loss when they occur.

- 1 (5) To serve as a central point to support local
- 2 interests and their efforts in all matters pertinent to fire
- 3 safety, fire prevention and fire control.
- 4 (6) To serve as a focal point for fire training
- 5 throughout this Commonwealth.
- 6 (7) To implement and oversee the Pennsylvania Volunteer
- 7 Loan Assistance Program.
- 8 (8) To oversee the Pennsylvania State Fire Academy.
- 9 (9) To recommend committee policy decisions to the
- 10 commission.
- 11 (10) To consult with the commission on the budget for
- the office of the commissioner.
- 13 (11) To oversee and administer a fire data incident
- 14 reporting system.
- 15 (12) To oversee and administer a forest fire prevention
- 16 program.
- 17 (13) To oversee and administer hazardous materials
- 18 training and certification.
- 19 (14) To oversee the Arson Task Force.
- 20 (d) Transfer.--The commission shall use, employ and expend,
- 21 in connection with the functions, powers and duties of the
- 22 commissioner, any contract obligations, records, files,
- 23 property, supplies and equipment now being used or held in
- 24 connection with such functions, powers and duties and the
- 25 unexpended balance of appropriations, allocations, Federal
- 26 grants and other funds available or to be made available for use
- 27 in connection with such functions, powers and duties transmitted
- 28 by Reorganization Plan No. 5 of 1981 (P.L. 612) and subsequently
- 29 transferred pursuant to 35 Pa.C.S. § 7315(b) (relating to
- 30 Pennsylvania State Fire Commissioner).

- 1 Section 5. Fire Operations Policy Committee.
- 2 (a) Establishment.--The Fire Operations Policy Committee is
- 3 hereby established to replace the Fire Safety Advisory Committee
- 4 established under 35 P.a.C.S. § 7318 (relating to Fire Safety
- 5 Advisory Committee).
- 6 (b) Membership. -- The operations committee shall be composed
- 7 of 11 members, to be appointed by the commission. Each of the
- 8 following entities shall, where applicable, submit a list of
- 9 three names, and the composition of the operations committee
- 10 shall be as follows:
- 11 (1) A career firefighter from the Pennsylvania
- 12 Professional Firefighters Association.
- 13 (2) An officer from the Philadelphia Fire Department.
- 14 (3) An officer from the Pittsburgh Fire Department.
- 15 (4) Three volunteer chiefs from the Keystone Fire Chiefs
- 16 Association.
- 17 (5) Two volunteer firefighters from the Firemen's
- 18 Association of the State of Pennsylvania.
- 19 (6) A fire police captain named from the Pennsylvania
- 20 Fire Police Association.
- 21 (7) A certified hazardous materials team leader from the
- 22 Pennsylvania Hazardous Materials Technicians Association.
- 23 (8) An officer from a second class township fire
- department.
- 25 (c) Chairperson.--The chairperson shall be elected by the
- 26 operations committee members.
- 27 (d) Quorum. -- Six members shall constitute a quorum.
- 28 (e) Terms.--Members of the operations committee shall serve
- 29 for three-year terms. No individual may serve more than two full
- 30 three-year terms.

- 1 (f) Meetings.--The operations committee shall meet at least
- 2 quarterly and shall publish its schedule one year in advance.
- 3 (g) Compensation and expenses. -- Operations committee members
- 4 shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for their
- 5 actual and necessary traveling and other expenses incurred in
- 6 connection with attendance at meetings.
- 7 (h) Powers and duties. -- The operations committee shall have
- 8 the following powers and duties:
- 9 (1) To develop plans and provide assistance to fire
- departments for successful implementation of an incident
- 11 command system in this Commonwealth.
- 12 (2) To develop programs to reduce firefighter death and
- injuries.
- 14 (3) To formulate Statewide firefighter health and safety
- programs.
- 16 (4) To develop programs and policies for a Statewide
- 17 fire incident reporting system.
- 18 (5) To develop and encourage consensus standards for
- 19 fire department operations that can be voluntarily adopted by
- 20 fire departments in this Commonwealth.
- 21 (6) To recommend operations committee policy decisions
- 22 to the commission.
- 23 (7) To develop a fire incident reporting system.
- 24 Section 6. Fire Training Policy Committee.
- 25 (a) Establishment. -- The Fire Training Policy Committee is
- 26 hereby established to replace the Fire Service Certification
- 27 Advisory Committee.
- 28 (b) Membership.--The training committee shall be composed of
- 29 11 members, to be appointed by the commission. Each of the
- 30 following entities shall, where applicable, submit a list of

- 1 three names, and the composition of the training committee shall
- 2 be as follows:
- 3 (1) A full-time training facility representative from
- 4 the Pennsylvania Fire Training Agency.
- 5 (2) A community college representative.
- 6 (3) An instructor from the Keystone Chapter of Fire
- 7 Service Instructors.
- 8 (4) A career union firefighter from the Pennsylvania
- 9 Professional Firefighters Association.
- 10 (5) Two representatives from the Firemen's Association
- of the State of Pennsylvania.
- 12 (6) A part-time training facilities representative.
- 13 (7) A member of industrial fire protection.
- 14 (8) A Pennsylvania State Fire Academy representative.
- 15 (9) A county fire training coordinator.
- 16 (10) A chief fire officer from the Keystone Fire Chiefs
- 17 Association.
- 18 (c) Chairperson. -- The chairperson shall be elected by the
- 19 training committee members.
- 20 (d) Quorum. -- Six members shall constitute a quorum.
- 21 (e) Terms.--Members of the training committee shall serve
- 22 for three-year terms. No individual may serve more than two
- 23 three-year terms.
- 24 (f) Meetings.--The training committee shall meet at least
- 25 quarterly and shall publish its schedule one year in advance.
- 26 (g) Compensation and expenses. -- Training committee members
- 27 shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for their
- 28 actual and necessary traveling and other expenses incurred in
- 29 connection with attendance at meetings.
- 30 (h) Powers and duties.--The training committee shall have

- 1 the following powers and duties:
- 2 (1) To develop, review and audit standards for State-
- 3 certified instructors.
- 4 (2) To develop a curriculum for State fire training and
- 5 review or revise such training as necessary.
- 6 (3) To develop and implement certification processes.
- 7 (4) To insure adequate delivery of State programs and
- 8 assist local and regional efforts.
- 9 (5) To recommend training committee policy decisions to
- 10 the commission.
- 11 Section 7. Hazardous Materials Planning and Response Policy
- 12 Committee.
- 13 (a) Establishment. -- The Hazardous Materials Planning and
- 14 Response Policy Committee is hereby established.
- 15 (b) Membership.--The hazardous materials committee shall be
- 16 composed of 11 members, to be appointed by the commission. Each
- 17 of the following entities shall, where applicable, submit a list
- 18 of three names, and the composition of the hazardous materials
- 19 committee shall be as follows:
- 20 (1) A representative from the Department of
- 21 Environmental Resources.
- 22 (2) A representative from an industrial trade
- 23 organization.
- 24 (3) Two certified hazardous materials team members from
- 25 the Pennsylvania Hazardous Materials Technician Association.
- 26 (4) A certified hazardous materials team leader from the
- 27 Pennsylvania Hazardous Materials Technician Association.
- 28 (5) A representative from PEMA.
- 29 (6) A chemical industry representative from the
- 30 Pennsylvania Chemical Industry Council.

- 1 (7) A fire chief from the Keystone Fire Chiefs
- 2 Association.
- 3 (8) A county emergency management agency director from
- 4 the Keystone Emergency Managers Association.
- 5 (9) A local emergency planning committee member.
- 6 (10) A representative from the Department of
- 7 Transportation.
- 8 (c) Chairperson.--Neither the commissioner nor a commission
- 9 staff member shall chair the hazardous materials committee. The
- 10 chairperson shall be elected by the hazardous materials
- 11 committee members.
- 12 (d) Quorum. -- Six members shall constitute a quorum.
- 13 (e) Terms.--Members of the hazardous materials committee
- 14 shall serve for three-year terms. No individual may serve more
- 15 than two full three-year terms.
- 16 (f) Meetings.--The hazardous materials committee shall meet
- 17 at least quarterly and shall publish its schedule one year in
- 18 advance. The hazardous materials committee shall also convene if
- 19 situations warrant.
- 20 (g) Compensation and expenses. -- Hazardous materials
- 21 committee members shall serve without compensation but may be
- 22 reimbursed for their actual and necessary traveling and other
- 23 expenses incurred in connection with attendance at meetings.
- 24 (h) Powers and duties. -- The hazardous materials committee
- 25 shall have the following powers and duties:
- 26 (1) To establish and develop policy, guidelines,
- 27 standards and regulations to implement the requirements of
- 28 the act of December 7, 1990 (P.L.639, No.165), known as the
- 29 Hazardous Material Emergency Planning and Response Act.
- 30 (2) To act as the central coordinating point for all

- 1 hazardous materials response, planning, prevention, training
- 2 and enforcement.
- 3 (3) To recommend hazardous materials committee policy
- 4 decisions to the commission.
- 5 Section 8. Fire Investigation Policy Committee.
- 6 (a) Establishment. -- The Fire Investigation Policy Committee
- 7 is hereby established.
- 8 (b) Membership.--The investigation committee shall be
- 9 composed of 11 members, to be appointed by the commission. Each
- 10 of the following entities shall, where applicable, submit a list
- 11 of three names, and the composition of the investigation
- 12 committee shall be as follows:
- 13 (1) The State Police Fire Marshal.
- 14 (2) A borough law enforcement officer.
- 15 (3) A township law enforcement officer.
- 16 (4) Two fire investigators from the Pennsylvania
- 17 Association of Arson Investigators.
- 18 (5) An insurance industry representative.
- 19 (6) A third-class city fire chief from the Third-Class
- 20 City Fire Chiefs Association.
- 21 (7) A borough volunteer fire chief.
- 22 (8) A township volunteer fire chief.
- 23 (9) A fire code officer.
- 24 (10) A citizen at large.
- 25 (c) Chairperson.--Neither the commissioner nor a commission
- 26 staff member shall chair the investigation committee. The
- 27 chairperson shall be elected by the investigation committee
- 28 members.
- 29 (d) Quorum. -- Six members shall constitute a quorum.
- 30 (e) Terms.--Members of the investigation committee shall

- 1 serve for three-year terms. No individual may serve more than
- 2 two full three-year terms.
- 3 (f) Meetings.--The investigation committee shall meet at
- 4 least quarterly and shall publish its schedule one year in
- 5 advance.
- 6 (g) Compensation and expenses. -- The investigation committee
- 7 members shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed
- 8 for their actual and necessary traveling and other expenses
- 9 incurred in connection with attendance at meetings.
- 10 (h) Powers and duties. -- The investigation committee shall
- 11 have the following powers and duties:
- 12 (1) To work as a task force with the Pennsylvania State
- 13 Police to oversee and set policy for a State fire
- investigation and arson task force.
- 15 (2) To develop policy and programs that address fire
- investigation, arson investigation and fire data collection.
- 17 (3) To recommend investigation committee policy
- decisions to the commission.
- 19 Section 9. Volunteer Loan Assistance Program Policy Committee.
- 20 (a) Establishment.--The Volunteer Loan Assistance Program
- 21 Policy Committee is hereby established.
- 22 (b) Membership.--The loan committee shall be composed of 11
- 23 members, to be appointed by the commission. Each of the
- 24 following entities shall, where applicable, submit a list of
- 25 three names, and the composition of the loan committee shall be
- 26 as follows:
- 27 (1) A volunteer fire chief from the Keystone Fire Chiefs
- 28 Association.
- 29 (2) A volunteer firefighter from the Firemen's
- 30 Association State of Pennsylvania.

- 1 (3) A Pennsylvania Emergency Health Services Council
- 2 representative.
- 3 (4) A Pennsylvania Bankers Association representative.
- 4 (5) An ambulance company chief from the Ambulance
- 5 Association of Pennsylvania.
- 6 (6) A fire apparatus manufacturer from the Fire
- 7 Apparatus Manufacturer's Association.
- 8 (7) A fire equipment manager from the Pennsylvania Fire
- 9 Equipment Distributors Association.
- 10 (8) A member of the Senate.
- 11 (9) A member of the House of Representatives.
- 12 (10) A representative of the Department of Labor and
- 13 Industry.
- 14 (11) A representative of the Department of General
- 15 Services.
- 16 (c) Chairperson.--Neither the commissioner nor a commission
- 17 staff member shall chair the loan committee. The chairperson
- 18 shall be elected by the loan committee members.
- 19 (d) Quorum. -- Six members shall constitute a quorum.
- 20 (e) Terms.--Members of the loan committee shall serve for
- 21 three-year terms. No individual may serve more than two full
- 22 three-year terms.
- 23 (f) Meetings.--The loan committee shall meet at least
- 24 quarterly and publish its schedule one year in advance.
- 25 (g) Compensation and expenses. -- The loan committee members
- 26 shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for their
- 27 actual and necessary traveling and other expenses incurred in
- 28 connection with attendance at meetings.
- 29 (h) Powers and duties. -- The loan committee shall have the
- 30 following powers and duties:

- 1 (1) As its principal duty, to apply the loan priorities
- 2 and eligibility standards set forth in 4 Pa. Code § 113.4
- 3 (relating to loan priorities and eligibility standards) to
- 4 their final decision on the volunteer company's loan
- 5 application.
- 6 (2) To render final decisions on loan applications made
- 7 by volunteer companies.
- 8 Section 10. Public Education Policy Committee.
- 9 (a) Establishment.--The Public Education Policy Committee is
- 10 hereby established.
- 11 (b) Membership. -- The education committee shall be composed
- 12 of seven members, appointed by the Governor, as follows:
- 13 (1) Two fire prevention educators from career fire
- departments, one to be from the Third-Class City Fire Chiefs
- 15 Association.
- 16 (2) Two fire prevention educators from volunteer fire
- departments who are members of the Firemen's Association
- 18 State of Pennsylvania.
- 19 (3) A primary school teacher from the Pennsylvania State

- 19 (a) Jurisdiction.--
- 20 (1) Jurisdiction over hazardous materials is hereby
- 21 transferred from the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency
- 22 to the State Fire Commission.
- 23 (2) Jurisdiction over forest fire prevention is hereby
- 24 transferred from the Department of Environmental Resources to
- 25 the State Fire Commission.
- 26 (b) Operations.--Operational control of the Fire Marshal's
- 27 Office of the Pennsylvania State Police is hereby transferred to
- 28 the State Fire Commission. The Fire Marshal's Office shall
- 29 continue to be funded by the Pennsylvania State Police.
- 30 Section 12. Repeal.
