AN ACT

- 1 Prohibiting certain public agencies and public utilities from
- 2 discriminating or according preferential treatment with
- 3 respect to employment, education and contracting.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Short title.
- 7 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Pennsylvania
- 8 Equal Rights Act.
- 9 Section 2. Definitions.
- 10 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 11 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 12 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 13 "Public agency." The General Assembly, the executive branch
- 14 of the government of this Commonwealth, any board, council,
- 15 authority or commission of this Commonwealth, any political

- 1 subdivision, any municipal or school authority, all State-aided
- 2 colleges and universities, all State-owned colleges and
- 3 universities, all State-related universities and all community
- 4 colleges or similar organizations created by or pursuant to a
- 5 statute which declares in substance that the organization
- 6 performs or has for its purpose the performance of an essential
- 7 governmental function. The term shall also include any officer
- 8 or employee of a public agency.
- 9 "Public utility." A public utility as defined in 66 Pa.C.S.
- 10 (relating to public utilities) and any officer or employee
- 11 thereof.
- 12 Section 3. Prohibition on certain discriminatory and
- 13 preferential treatment in public employment,
- 14 education and contracting.
- No public agency or public utility shall use race, sex,
- 16 color, ancestry or national origin as a criterion for either
- 17 discriminating against or granting preferential treatment to any
- 18 individual or group with respect to employment, education or
- 19 contracting.
- 20 Section 4. Exceptions.
- 21 Nothing in this act shall be interpreted as:
- 22 (1) Prohibiting classifications based on sex that are
- 23 reasonably necessary to the normal operation of this
- 24 Commonwealth's system public employment or public education,
- insofar as such classifications are not prohibited by section
- 26 28 of Article I of the Constitution of Pennsylvania.
- 27 (2) Inhibiting official action that is necessary to
- establish or maintain eligibility for any Federal program,
- where ineligibility would result in a loss of Federal funds
- to the Commonwealth or any political subdivision.

- 1 (3) Prohibiting any public agency or public utility from
- obeying a court order requiring the consideration of racial,
- 3 ethnic, national origin, gender or religious characteristics
- 4 to remedy the effect of its own past discriminatory
- 5 practices.
- 6 Section 5. Remedies.
- 7 A person who alleges a violation of this act by any public
- 8 agency or any public utility may bring a civil action in a court
- 9 of competent jurisdiction for appropriate injunctive or other
- 10 equitable relief and compensatory damages against the public
- 11 agency or public utility within one year after the occurrence of
- 12 the alleged violation. A court shall also award the complainant
- 13 all or a portion of the costs of litigation, including
- 14 reasonable attorney fees and witness fees, if the court
- 15 determines that the award is appropriate.
- 16 Section 6. Notice.
- 17 Each public agency and public utility shall post notices and
- 18 use other appropriate means to notify employees and keep them
- 19 informed of protections and obligations under this act.
- 20 Section 7. Severability.
- 21 The provisions of this act are severable. If any provision of
- 22 this act or its application to any person or circumstance is
- 23 held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions
- 24 or applications of this act which can be given effect without
- 25 the invalid provision or application.
- 26 Section 8. Repeals.
- 27 All acts and parts of acts are repealed insofar as they are
- 28 inconsistent with this act.
- 29 Section 9. Applicability.
- This act shall apply to actions taken after the effective

- 1 date of this act.
- 2 Section 10. Effective date.
- 3 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
