Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the 1 2 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, further providing for sentencing for criminal mischief. 3 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 6 Section 1. Section 9720 of Title 42 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a subsection to read: § 9720. Sentencing for criminal mischief. 9 (c) Restriction of operating privilege. --10 11 (1) If a person is convicted of or a minor is 12 adjudicated delinquent for a violation of 18 Pa.C.S. §§ 3304(a) and 3307(a.1), the court shall order that the 13 operating privilege of the person be suspended for a period 14 15 of not more than one year.

(2) If at the time of conviction or adjudication of

delinquency the person's operating privilege has been

2 <u>suspended or revoked, the court shall order the Department of</u>

3 <u>Transportation to extend the period of suspension or</u>

4 <u>revocation by an additional period of not more than one year.</u>

5 (3) In the case of a minor who is ineligible by reason

6 of age for a driver's license, the court shall order the

Department of Transportation to withhold issuance of the

minor's driver's license for not more than one year after the

date on which the minor would otherwise have become eligible

to apply for a driver's license.

- (4) A person whose driver's license or operating privilege is revoked, suspended or withheld may, subject to court approval, elect to reduce the period of revocation, suspension or withholding by performing court-supervised community service under this subsection. The court shall establish the terms under which the period of revocation, suspension or withholding may be reduced by the performance of community service, and shall notify the Department of Transportation of the reduction, if any, approved by the court.
- (5) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, a person whose driver's license has been suspended under this subsection shall be eligible to apply for an occupational limited license under 75 Pa.C.S. § 1553

 (relating to occupational limited license) if suspension of the person's operating privilege would create an undue family hardship and the person requires a driver's license for employment, medical or educational purposes.
- 29 (6) An insurer shall not increase premiums, impose any
 30 surcharge or rate penalty, or make any driver record point

- 1 assignment for automobile insurance, nor shall an insurer
- 2 <u>cancel or refuse to renew an automobile insurance policy on</u>

- 4 (7) Community service performed under this subsection
- 5 shall be in addition to a period of community service ordered
- 6 under subsection (a).
- 7 (8) As used in this subsection, the term "community
- 8 service" means cleaning graffiti from public property.
- 9 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
