- 2 WHEREAS, Dr. Jonas Salk developed the world's first virus to
- 3 battle the polio scourge that had gripped the world throughout
- 4 the 20th century; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Dr. Salk was known for his compassion and for his
- 6 zeal in pursuing new medical concepts; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Dr. Salk joined the faculty of the University of
- 8 Pittsburgh School of Medicine in 1947 and stayed there for 16
- 9 years; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Dr. Salk developed his oral polio vaccine during the
- 11 1950's, while working as director of the University of
- 12 Pittsburgh Medical School's virus research laboratory; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Dr. Salk pursued his ideas and conducted research by
- 14 working with medical staff and polio patients at D. T. Watson
- 15 Rehabilitation Services in Sewickley; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Dr. Salk dedicated his life to seeking cures for
- 2 polio, multiple sclerosis, cancer and AIDS; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Dr. Jonas Salk passed away near his home in La
- 4 Jolla, California, on June 23, 1995; therefore be it
- 5 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives memorialize the
- 6 late Dr. Jonas Salk.
