25	Section 1. Section 710(i) of the act of April 9, 1929

26 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929,

1 amended October 3, 1986 (P.L.1414, No.129), is amended to read: 2 Section 710. Pennsylvania State Police.--The Pennsylvania 3 State Police shall have the power and its duty shall be: 4 * * *

5 (i) To collect information relating to crimes and incidents related to the <u>actual or perceived</u> race, color, religion [or], 6 national origin or sexual orientation of individuals or groups, 7 which shall be reported monthly by all local law enforcement 8 agencies and the State Fire Marshal. Any information, records 9 and statistics collected in accordance with this subsection 10 11 shall be available for use by any agency required to furnish information, to the extent that such information is reasonably 12 13 necessary or useful to such agency in carrying out the duties 14 imposed on it by law. The Commissioner of the Pennsylvania State 15 Police may, by regulation, establish such conditions for the use 16 or availability of such information as may be necessary to its 17 preservation, the protection of confidential information, or the 18 circumstances of a pending prosecution. For purposes of this clause, the term "sexual orientation" shall mean homosexuality, 19 20 heterosexuality or bisexuality.

21 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
