AN ACT

Providing for screening of patients for symptoms of domestic 1 2 violence; establishing the Domestic Violence Health Care 3 Response Program in the Department of Public Welfare; AND providing for domestic violence medical advocacy projects to 4 assist in implementation of domestic violence policies, 5 procedures, health care worker training and hospital, health 6 7 center and clinic response to domestic violence victims. and 8 making an appropriation.

9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

10 hereby enacts as follows:

11 Section 1. Short title.

12 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Domestic

13 Violence Health Care Response Act.

14 Section 2. Definitions.

15 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall

16 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the

17 context clearly indicates otherwise:

18 "Department." The Department of Public Welfare of the

1 Commonwealth.

"Domestic Violence Program." A nonprofit organization or
program having a primary purpose of providing services to
domestic violence victims, including, but not limited to, crisis
hot line, safe homes or shelter, community education,
counseling, victim advocacy, systems intervention and
information, transportation, information and referral and victim
assistance.

9 "Health center." A for-profit or nonprofit health center10 providing clinically related health services.

11 "Health clinic." A for-profit or nonprofit clinic providing 12 health services.

13 "Hospital." A for-profit or nonprofit basic, general or 14 comprehensive hospital providing clinically related health 15 services.

16 "Medical advocacy." The provision of education and training 17 for the purpose of universal screening in order to identify 18 victims of domestic violence who are seeking medical treatment 19 for related or unrelated reasons.

20 "Universal screening." The process of asking all patients 21 seeking medical treatment at a hospital, health center or clinic 22 during the course of medical examinations or treatment about the 23 possibility of domestic violence within their relationships, 24 regardless of whether they are suspected to be victims of 25 domestic violence. <-----

26 Section 3. Domestic Violence Health Care Response Program.
27 (a) Establishment of program.--There is established within
28 the Department of Public Welfare the Domestic Violence Health
29 Care Response Program.

30 (b) Purpose of programs.--The purpose of the program shall 19980H2268B3979 - 2 - be to support the development of up to 25 domestic violence medical advocacy projects in this Commonwealth which would assist in the implementation of domestic violence policies and procedures as well as provide training for health care workers to improve hospital, health center and clinic response to domestic violence victims seeking medical treatment.

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7 (c) Medical advocacy project sites.--The department shall
8 select medical advocacy project sites with representation from
9 urban, rural and suburban areas. To ensure the effectiveness of
10 the program, the project sites shall not be publicized.

(d) Annual report.--Utilizing information provided under subsection (e)(5), the department shall compile an annual report to be submitted to the chairman and minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate and the chairman and minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives providing oversight of the Department of Public Welfare.

18 (e) Program elements.--Each domestic violence medical19 advocacy project shall:

20 (1) Demonstrate active collaboration between a local
21 community-based domestic violence program and the hospital,
22 health center or clinic participating in the project.

(2) Develop and implement uniform multidisciplinary
domestic violence policies and procedures which incorporate
the roles and responsibilities of all staff who provide
services or interact with victims of domestic violence,
including the identification of victims of domestic violence
through universal screening.

29 (3) Develop and implement a multidisciplinary,
30 comprehensive and ongoing domestic violence education and
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1 training program for hospital, health center or clinic personnel adapted to the particular hospital's, health 2 3 center's or clinic's demographics, policies, staffing 4 patterns and resources. The training program shall include, 5 but is not limited to, identifying characteristics of 6 domestic violence, screening all patients for domestic violence, appropriately documenting in the medical record and 7 8 offering referral services, including domestic violence resources available in the community. 9

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10 (4) Provide available educational materials to inform
11 victims of domestic violence about the services and
12 assistance available through the domestic violence program.

13 (5) Develop formal project assessment procedures, 14 including, but not limited to, coordinating and collecting 15 data for the evaluation of the projects and their 16 effectiveness in reducing the incidence of domestic violence 17 and overall health care costs, including emergency room 18 costs.

19 Section 4. Appropriation.

The sum of \$1,500,000, or as much thereof as may be required, is hereby appropriated to the Department of Public Welfare for fiscal year July 1, 1998, to June 30, 1999, to carry out the provisions of this act. This appropriation may not be used to supplant Federal and State funds otherwise available for domestic violence services. Section 5 4. Effective date.
