AN ACT

Amending the act of March 11, 1971 (P.L.104, No.3), entitled, as 1 2 amended, "An act providing property tax or rent rebate and 3 inflation dividends to certain senior citizens, widows, 4 widowers and permanently disabled persons with limited 5 incomes; establishing uniform standards and qualifications 6 for eligibility to receive rebates and dividends; providing 7 for transportation assistance grants and grants to area agencies on aging for services to older persons; and imposing 8 duties upon the Department of Revenue," further providing for 9 the definition of "income." 10

11 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

12 hereby enacts as follows:

13 Section 1. Section 3(1) of the act of March 11, 1971

14 (P.L.104, No.3), known as the Senior Citizens Rebate and

15 Assistance Act, reenacted and amended December 21, 1979

16 (P.L.570, No.131), is amended to read:

- 17 Section 3. Definitions.--As used in this act:
- 18 (1) "Income" means all income from whatever source derived,

including but not limited to salaries, wages, bonuses, 1 commissions, income from self-employment, alimony, support 2 3 money, cash public assistance and relief, the gross amount of 4 any pensions or annuities including railroad retirement benefits, all benefits received under the Federal Social 5 Security Act (except Medicare benefits and Medicare Plan B 6 premiums), all benefits received under State unemployment 7 8 insurance laws and veterans' disability payments, all interest received from the Federal or any State government, or any 9 10 instrumentality or political subdivision thereof, realized 11 capital gains, rentals, workmen's compensation and the gross amount of loss of time insurance benefits, life insurance 12 13 benefits and proceeds (except the first five thousand dollars 14 (\$5,000) of the total of death benefit payments), and gifts of 15 cash or property (other than transfers by gift between members of a household) in excess of a total value of three hundred 16 17 dollars (\$300), but shall not include surplus food or other 18 relief in kind supplied by a governmental agency or property tax or rent rebate or inflation dividend. 19

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Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

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
