A RESOLUTION

- 1 Memorializing Congress to abolish the so-called marriage tax 2 penalty.
- 3 WHEREAS, Many Americans are forced to pay more Federal taxes
- 4 each year simply because they are married: when a couple files
- 5 their income tax return and they add the second income to the
- 6 first, the lower income or both incomes are often subject to a
- 7 higher tax bracket; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The Congressional Budget Office estimates that 23
- 9 million Americans are affected by this marriage tax penalty
- 10 every year, with these families paying an average of \$1,400 per
- 11 family in additional taxes because of the so-called marriage tax
- 12 penalty; and
- 13 WHEREAS, This additional income tax is especially burdensome
- 14 on the working poor, as a two-income family making less than
- 15 \$20,000 must devote a full 8% of its total income just to pay
- 16 the average marriage tax penalty; and
- 17 WHEREAS, The marriage tax penalty creates a fiscal

- 1 disincentive for marriage which can contribute to the breakdown
- 2 of the social and economic stability of the family unit;
- 3 therefore be it
- 4 RESOLVED, That the Senate of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 memorialize the Congress of the United States to enact
- 6 legislation that abolishes the marriage tax penalty; and be it
- 7 further
- 8 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
- 9 the presiding officers of each house of Congress and to each
- 10 member of Congress from Pennsylvania.
