AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, further providing for grading of theft
- offenses.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 3903(a) and (a.1) of Title 18 of the
- 7 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to read:
- 8 § 3903. Grading of theft offenses.
- 9 (a) Felony of the second degree. -- Theft constitutes a felony
- 10 of the second degree if [the]:
- 11 (1) The offense is committed during a manmade disaster,
- 12 a natural disaster or a war-caused disaster and constitutes a
- 13 violation of section 3921 (relating to theft by unlawful
- taking or disposition), 3925 (relating to receiving stolen
- property), 3928 (relating to unauthorized use of automobiles
- and other vehicles) or 3929 (relating to retail theft).
- 17 (2) The property stolen is a firearm.
- 18 (3) In the case of theft by receiving stolen property,

- 1 the property received, retained or disposed of is a firearm
- and the receiver is in the business of buying or selling
- 3 <u>stolen property.</u>
- 4 (a.1) Felony of the third degree.--Except as provided in
- 5 subsection (a), theft constitutes a felony of the third degree
- 6 if the amount involved exceeds \$2,000, or if the property stolen
- 7 is [a firearm,] an automobile, airplane, motorcycle, motorboat
- 8 or other motor-propelled vehicle, or in the case of theft by
- 9 receiving stolen property, if the receiver is in the business of
- 10 buying or selling stolen property.

- 12 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
