AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 23, 1972 (P.L.136, No.52), entitled 2 "An act relating to the practice of psychology, providing for 3 licensing of psychologists, making certain acts illegal and 4 providing penalties," adding additional powers of sanction to 5 the board.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- hereby enacts as follows:
- Section 1. Sections 3(3) and 8(b) of the act of March 23, 8
- 1972 (P.L.136, No.52), known as the Professional Psychologists
- Practice Act, amended April 25, 1986 (P.L.89, No.33), are 10
- amended to read: 11
- 12 Section 3. Necessity for License. -- It shall be unlawful for
- 13 any person to engage in the practice of psychology or to offer
- 14 or attempt to do so or to hold himself out to the public by any
- 15 title or description of services incorporating the words
- "psychological," "psychologist" or "psychology" unless he shall 16
- first have obtained a license pursuant to this act, except as 17

- 1 hereinafter provided:

- 3 (3) [Nothing] Except as provided in section 8(b)(7), nothing
- 4 in this act shall be construed to prevent qualified members of
- 5 other recognized professions, including, but not limited to,
- 6 clergy, drug and alcohol abuse counselors, mental health
- 7 counselors, social workers, marriage counselors, family
- 8 counselors, crisis intervention counselors, pastoral counselors,
- 9 rehabilitation counselors and psychoanalysts, from doing work of
- 10 a psychological nature consistent with the training and the code
- 11 of ethics of their respective professions or to prevent
- 12 volunteers from providing services in crisis or emergency
- 13 situations.

- 15 Section 8. Refusal, Suspension or Revocation of License. --*

- 17 (b) When the board finds that the license or application for
- 18 license of any person may be refused, revoked, restricted or
- 19 suspended under the terms of subsection (a), the board may:
- 20 (1) Deny the application for a license.
- 21 (2) Administer a public reprimand.
- 22 (3) Revoke, suspend, limit or otherwise restrict a license
- 23 as determined by the board.
- 24 (4) Require a licensee to submit to the care, counseling or
- 25 treatment of a physician or a psychologist designated by the
- 26 board.
- 27 (5) Suspend enforcement of its findings thereof and place a
- 28 licensee on probation with the right to vacate the probationary
- 29 order for noncompliance.
- 30 (6) Restore a suspended license to practice psychology and

- impose any disciplinary or corrective measure which it might 1
- 2 originally have imposed.
- (7) Take other action as the board in its discretion 3
- considers proper, including precluding a suspended licensee from 4
- engaging in counseling or any other form of mental health 5
- 6 practice.

- Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days. 8
