1 2 3	Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, prohibiting the possession of a firearm or other dangerous weapon in a municipal building.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
7	Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
8	§ 914. Possession of firearm or other dangerous weapon in
9	municipal building.
10	(a) Offense defined A person commits an offense if he:
11	(1) knowingly possesses a firearm or other dangerous
12	weapon in a municipal building or knowingly causes a firearm
13	or other dangerous weapon to be present in a municipal
14	building; or
15	(2) knowingly possesses a firearm or other dangerous
16	weapon in a municipal building with the intent that the
17	firearm or other dangerous weapon be used in the commission
18	of a crime or knowingly causes a firearm or other dangerous

- 2 that the firearm or other dangerous weapon be used in the
- 3 <u>commission of a crime.</u>
- 4 <u>(b) Grading.--</u>
- 5 (1) Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (3), an
- 6 offense under subsection (a)(1) is a misdemeanor of the third
- 7 degree.
- 8 (2) An offense under subsection (a)(2) is a misdemeanor
- 9 <u>of the first degree.</u>
- 10 (3) An offense under subsection (a)(1) is a summary
- offense if the person was carrying a firearm under section
- 12 <u>6106(b) (relating to firearms not to be carried without a</u>
- license) or 6109 (relating to licenses).
- 14 (c) Exceptions. -- Subsection (a) shall not apply to:
- 15 (1) The lawful performance of official duties by an
- officer, agent or employee of the United States, the
- 17 <u>Commonwealth or a political subdivision who is authorized by</u>
- 18 law to engage in or supervise the prevention, detection,
- 19 investigation or prosecution of any violation of law.
- 20 (2) The carrying of rifles and shotguns by instructors
- 21 and participants in a course of instruction provided by the
- 22 Pennsylvania Game Commission under 34 Pa.C.S. § 2704
- 23 (relating to eligibility for license).
- 24 (3) Associations of veteran soldiers and their
- 25 auxiliaries or members of organized armed forces of the
- 26 <u>United States or the Commonwealth, including reserve</u>
- 27 components, when engaged in the performance of ceremonial
- 28 <u>duties with county approval.</u>
- 29 (d) Posting of notice. -- Notice of the provisions of
- 30 subsection (a) shall be posted conspicuously at each public

- 1 <u>entrance to each municipal building.</u>
- 2 (e) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 3 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 4 subsection:
- 5 <u>"Dangerous weapon." No bomb, grenade, blackjack, sandbag,</u>
- 6 metal knuckles, dagger, knife, the blade of which is exposed in
- 7 <u>an automatic way by switch, push-button, spring mechanism or</u>
- 8 otherwise, or other implement for the infliction of serious
- 9 bodily injury which serves no common lawful purpose.
- 10 <u>"Firearm." Any weapon, including a starter gun, which will</u>
- 11 or is designed to expel a projectile or projectiles by the
- 12 action of an explosion, expansion of gas or escape of gas. The
- 13 term does not include any device designed or used exclusively
- 14 for the firing of stud cartridges, explosive rivets or similar
- 15 <u>industrial ammunition</u>.
- 16 "Municipal building." Any building owned or leased by a
- 17 county, city, borough, incorporated town, township or a home
- 18 rule municipality.
- 19 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
