AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 71 (State Government) of the Pennsylvania 2 Consolidated Statutes, further providing for the definition
- 3 of "enforcement officer."
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. The definition of "enforcement officer" in
- 7 section 5102 of Title 71 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 8 Statutes is amended to read:
- 9 § 5102. Definitions.
- 10 The following words and phrases as used in this part, unless
- 11 a different meaning is plainly required by the context, shall
- 12 have the following meanings:
- 13 * * *
- 14 "Enforcement officer."
- 15 (1) Any enforcement officer or investigator of the
- 16 Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board who is a peace officer
- 17 vested with police power and authority throughout the

Commonwealth and any administrative or supervisory employee of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board vested with police power who is charged with the administration or enforcement

of the liquor laws of the Commonwealth.

- (2) Special agents, narcotics agents, asset forfeiture agents, medicaid fraud agents and senior investigators hazardous waste prosecutions unit, classified as such and employed by the Office of Attorney General who have within the scope of their employment as law enforcement officers the power to enforce the law and make arrests under the authority of the act of October 15, 1980 (P.L.950, No.164), known as the Commonwealth Attorneys Act.
 - (3) Parole agents, classified as such by the Executive Board and employed by the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole.
 - (4) Waterways conservation officers and other commissioned law enforcement personnel employed by the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission who have and exercise the same law enforcement powers as waterways conservation officers. This paragraph shall not apply to deputy waterways conservation officers.
- (5) Employees of the Department of Revenue who are 22 23 designated by the Secretary of Revenue as revenue agents and 24 vested with police powers under the authority of 75 Pa.C.S. 25 §§ 6117 (relating to authority of qualified employees of department and Department of Revenue), 9019 (relating to 26 27 diesel fuel importers and transporters; prohibiting use of 28 dyed diesel fuel on highways; violations and penalties) and 29 9403 (relating to revenue agents; powers), and any administrative or supervisory employee of the Department of 30

- administration or enforcement of the revenue laws of this 2

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- Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days. 5
