## A RESOLUTION

1 Memorializing the Citizens' Stamp Advisory Committee of the  
2 United States Postal Service to consider and recommend to the  
3 United States Postal Service Board of Governors the issue of  
4 a commemorative stamp honoring one-room schoolhouses in the  
5 United States.

6 WHEREAS, The House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of  
7 Pennsylvania recognizes the historical and educational value of  
8 one-room schoolhouses; and

9 WHEREAS, Public and private one-room schools are found, and  
10 some continue to operate, in rural communities throughout the  
11 United States; and

12 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania, Nebraska and Montana have erected and  
13 preserved the most one-room schools; therefore be it

14 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the  
15 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania memorialize the Citizens' Stamp

2 consider and recommend to the United States Postal Service Board  
3 of Governors the issue of a commemorative stamp honoring one-
