A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 2 3 4 5	Directing the Joint State Government Commission to study and make recommendations concerning the issue of highway safety and driver distractions, including communications technology, electronic entertainment and other nontechnological distractions.
б	WHEREAS, There are many opportunities for driver distractions
7	while operating a motor vehicle, including, but not limited to,
8	communications technology, electronic entertainment, COMPUTER
9	USE, fatigue, reading, food and beverage consumption and
10	passengers, including children and pets; and
11	WHEREAS, Persons who use Pennsylvania highways pay, through
12	registration fees or the liquid fuels tax, for highway
13	maintenance and construction; and
14	WHEREAS, The General Assembly has a responsibility to the
15	taxpayers to ensure that the public roads and highways are as
16	safe as possible by enacting enforceable traffic safety laws;
17	therefore be it
18	RESOLVED (the House of Representatives concurring), That the

1 Senate direct the Joint State Government Commission:

(1) To study and develop recommendations concerning the 2 3 issue of highway safety and driver distractions, including 4 communications technology and electronic entertainment such 5 as wireless telephones, pagers, facsimile machines, COMPUTERS, locator devices, AM/FM radios, compact disc 6 players, audio cassette players, citizens band radios and 7 8 dispatch radios, and all other forms of nontechnological 9 distractions.

10 (2) To review and analyze studies and statistics
11 relating to all types of driver distractions which affect
12 highway and traffic safety.

13 (3) To inquire into innovative communications 14 technologies being used or proposed to be used in motor 15 vehicles that may help alleviate risks to highway and traffic 16 safety.

17 (4) To develop recommendations for public and private 18 strategies and recommendations for legislative or regulatory 19 action if deemed appropriate to address these issues; 20 and be it further

21 RESOLVED, That the Department of Transportation and the 22 Pennsylvania State Police assist the Joint State Government 23 Commission in supplying and gathering statistics relating to all 24 types of driver distractions which affect highway and traffic 25 safety in this Commonwealth; and be it further

26 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission make an 27 interim report on its findings and recommendations to the 28 General Assembly on December 1, 2000 BY JANUARY 2, 2001, and a 29 final report on BY December 1, 2001.
