25	Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known

2 Section 213.1. Veterans' Ombudsman.--(a) The Governor shall 3 appoint and fix the compensation of a veterans' ombudsman in 4 <u>each administrative agency</u>, except those of the Department of 5 Auditor General and Treasury Department, who shall represent the interests of veterans in all aspects of the operation of the 6 7 agency. (b) The veterans' ombudsman in each administrative agency 8 9 shall not hold any other position or perform any other duties in that agency except those duties relating to the position of 10 11 veterans' ombudsman. 12 (c) The veterans' ombudsman must have a working knowledge of 13 veterans' rights and benefits.

14 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
