AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," providing for tax effort poverty supplements and for supplemental payments on account of transportation for severe special education students.

- 9 hereby enacts as follows:
- 10 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 11 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding sections
- 12 to read:
- 13 Section 2502.39. Tax Effort Poverty Supplement.--Beginning
- 14 with the 2001-2002 school year, a school district whose local
- 15 tax effort equals or exceeds twenty-one and one-tenth mills
- 16 (21.1) and whose percentage of average daily membership receives
- 17 free or reduced lunches under section 1337(d) shall receive a
- 18 supplemental payment equal to one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for

- 1 <u>each of its average daily membership.</u>
- 2 <u>Section 2541.1. Supplemental Payments on Account of</u>
- 3 Transportation for Severe Special Education Students. -- Beginning
- 4 with the 2001-2002 school year, each school district providing
- 5 transportation for its resident students shall receive a
- 6 <u>supplemental payment for the transportation of severe special</u>
- 7 <u>education students equal to the product of one per centum (1%)</u>
- 8 of the school district's average daily membership times one
- 9 <u>thousand eight hundred dollars (\$1,800).</u>
- 10 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2001.
