AN ACT

1 Providing for control of certain types of herbicide applications
2 by counties of the sixth class.

3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
4 hereby enacts as follows:

5 Section 1. Definitions.

6 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
7 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
8 context clearly indicates otherwise:

9 "Defoliant." Any substance or mixture of substances intended
10 for causing the leaves or foliage to drop from a plant, with or
11 without causing abscission.

12 "Desiccant" Any substance or mixture of substances intended
13 for artificially accelerating the drying of plant tissue.

14 "Herbicide." Any substance or mixture of substances intended
15 for use as a plant regulator, defoliant or desiccant.

16 "Plant regulator." Any substance or mixture of substances

1 intended, through physiological action, for accelerating or
2 retarding the rate of growth or rate of maturation, or for
3 otherwise altering the behavior of plants or the produce
4 thereof, but shall not include substances to the extent that
5 they are intended as plant nutrients, trace elements,
6 nutritional chemicals, plant inoculants, and soil amendments.
7 Also, the term "plant regulator" shall not be required to
8 include any of such of those nutrient mixtures or soil
9 amendments as are commonly known as vitamin-hormone
10 horticultural products, intended for improvement, maintenance,
11 survival, health, and propagation of plants, and as are not for
12 pest destruction and are nontoxic, nonpoisonous in the undiluted
13 packaged concentration.

14 Section 2. General rule.

15 A county of the sixth class may, by ordinance, regulate or
16 prohibit the application of a herbicide within a highway right-
17 of-way or public utility easement in the county.

18 Section 3. Repeal.

19 All acts and parts of acts are repealed insofar as they are
20 inconsistent with this act.

21 Section 4. Effective date.

22 This act shall take effect immediately.
