AN ACT

- Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, defining the offense of delivery of 3 facsimile biological or chemical agent; and imposing a 4 penalty. 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 7 Section 1. Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a section to read: § 5518. Delivery of facsimile biological or chemical agent.
- 10 (a) Offense defined. -- A person commits an offense if the
- 11 person intentionally delivers or causes to be delivered a
- 12 facsimile biological or chemical agent:
- 13 (1) with the intent to threaten, terrify, intimidate or
- 14 harass an individual;
- 15 (2) with the intent to cause evacuation of a building,
- place of assembly or facility of public transportation; or 16

- 1 (3) with the intent to cause serious public
- 2 inconvenience.
- 3 (b) Exceptions.--The provisions of this section shall not
- 4 apply to research, medical or veterinary services, including
- 5 immunizations, vaccinations or other treatments administered
- 6 during the normal scope of practice.
- 7 (c) Grading. -- An offense under subsection (a) constitutes a
- 8 felony of the third degree.
- 9 <u>(d) Restitution.--A person convicted of violating this</u>
- 10 section shall, in addition to any other sentence imposed, be
- 11 <u>sentenced to pay restitution in an amount equal to the cost of</u>
- 12 any evacuation, including, but not limited to, the cost of fire,
- 13 police or ambulance response and the transportation of staff
- 14 from the building, place of assembly or facility.
- 15 (e) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
- 16 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 17 subsection:
- 18 "Biological agent." A natural pathogen, toxin, virus,
- 19 bacteria, prion, fungus or genetically engineered pathogen,
- 20 toxin, virus, bacteria, prion or fungus which causes infectious
- 21 <u>disease or bodily harm.</u>
- 22 "Chemical agent." Any of the following:
- 23 (1) Nerve agent, including, but not limited to, Tabun
- 24 (GA), Sarin (GB), Soman (GD), GF and VX.
- 25 (2) Choking agent, including, but not limited to,
- 26 <u>Phosgene (CG) and Diphosgene (DP).</u>
- 27 (3) Blood agent, including, but not limited to, Hydrogen
- 28 <u>Cyanide (AC), Cyanogen Chloride (CK) and Arsine (SA).</u>
- 29 <u>(4) Blister agent, including, but not limited to,</u>
- 30 mustard (H, HD (sulfur mustard)), HN-1, HN-2, HN-3 (nitrogen

- 1 mustard), arsenical, such as Lewisite (L), urticant, such as
- CX; and incapacitating agent, such as BZ. 2
- "Facsimile biological or chemical agent." A device or 3
- 4 <u>substance which resembles in appearance and external qualities a</u>
- biological or chemical agent but does not have the capability to 5
- 6 cause death or bodily harm.
- Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days. 7
