AN ACT

1 Amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), entitled  
2 "An act concerning elections, including general, municipal,  
3 special and primary elections, the nomination of candidates,  
4 primary and election expenses and election contests; creating  
5 and defining membership of county boards of elections;  
6 imposing duties upon the Secretary of the Commonwealth,  
7 courts, county boards of elections, county commissioners;  
8 imposing penalties for violation of the act, and codifying,  
9 revising and consolidating the laws relating thereto; and  
10 repealing certain acts and parts of acts relating to  
11 elections," further providing for additional powers and  
12 duties of the Secretary of the Commonwealth.

13 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  
14 hereby enacts as follows:

15 Section 1. Section 1640 of the act of June 3, 1937  
16 (P.L.1333, No.320), known as the Pennsylvania Election Code,  
17 added October 4, 1978 (P.L.893, No.171), is amended to read:

18 Section 1640. Additional Powers and Duties of the Secretary  
19 of the Commonwealth.--The Secretary of the Commonwealth shall  
20 have the following additional powers and duties:

21 (1) To serve as the State clearing house for information  
22 concerning the administration of this act.

1       (2) To prescribe suitable rules and regulations to carry out  
2 the provisions of this act.

3       (3) To develop the prescribed forms required by the  
4 provisions of this article for the making of the reports and  
5 statements required to be filed with the supervisor.

6       (4) To prepare a manual setting forth recommended uniform  
7 methods of bookkeeping and reporting which shall be furnished by  
8 the supervisor to the person required to file such reports and  
9 statements as required by this article.

10      (5) To examine the contributions to State legislative and  
11 Statewide candidates and publish a list of all those political  
12 committees who have contributed to candidates or who have  
13 received contributions and who have failed to file reports as  
14 required by this act within six (6) days of their failure to  
15 comply.

16      Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
