3 WHEREAS, On May 21, 1881, Clara Barton founded the American

- 5 WHEREAS, In 1900 the Congress of the United States granted
- 6 the American Red Cross a charter, making the volunteer
- 7 organization responsible for providing services to members of
- 8 the armed forces of the United States and relief to disaster
- 9 victims at home and abroad; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Today's American Red Cross is a humanitarian

organization led by volunteers that provides relief to victims
 of disasters and helps people prevent, prepare for and respond
 to emergencies; and

WHEREAS, The American Red Cross strives to prevent and
alleviate human suffering wherever it may be found; and
WHEREAS, The purpose of the American Red Cross is to protect
life and health and to ensure respect for the human being; and
WHEREAS, The American Red Cross makes no discrimination as to
nationality, race, religious beliefs, class or political

11 WHEREAS, Services provided by the American Red Cross promote 12 mutual understanding, friendship, cooperation and lasting peace 13 among all peoples; and

14 WHEREAS, The American Red Cross endeavors to relieve the 15 suffering of individuals, being guided solely by needs and giving priority to the most urgent cases of distress; and 16 17 WHEREAS, The American Red Cross is a voluntary relief movement not prompted in any manner by desire for gain; and 18 19 WHEREAS, The American Red Cross has provided indispensable 20 services of an inestimable value in every community in this 21 Commonwealth and throughout the United States for more than 100 22 years; and

23 WHEREAS, The American Red Cross will continue to play a 24 valuable role in catastrophic relief and volunteerism during the 25 21st century; therefore be it
