- 10 WHEREAS, Excellence displayed in athletic competition has
- 11 long been recognized by societal and community rewards provided
- 12 for that competition; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Academic competition is an innovative and creative

- 2 members in an educational forum for excellence; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Academic competition helps to hone the abilities and
- 4 intellectual skills of students, as well as providing
- 5 opportunities for incentives to continue the pursuit of

- 7 WHEREAS, A coordinated program of academic competition has
- 8 not existed in this Commonwealth, except in isolated school
- 9 district programs; therefore be it
