A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 Memorializing Congress to pass legislation permitting
- 2 importation from Canada of approved prescription drugs.
- 3 WHEREAS, The cost of prescription drugs continues to
- 4 increase; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services
- 6 predict that spending on prescription drugs will increase by an
- 7 average of 12% every year for the next decade; and
- 8 WHEREAS, In the United States, 35% of seniors lack drug
- 9 coverage, 80% of retired persons take at least one prescription
- 10 drug per day, and the average Medicare beneficiary will spend
- 11 \$942 this year on their prescription drugs; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Many seniors are forced to choose between housing,
- 13 food or their prescription drugs, since the average senior
- 14 receiving Social Security is living on only \$780 per month; and
- 15 WHEREAS, There is a significant differential in prices of

- 1 prescription drugs between the United States and Canada, and the
- 2 Federal General Accounting Office reported that prescription
- 3 drugs in the United States were priced approximately 34% higher
- 4 than the same products in Canada; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Under Federal law, it is illegal for individuals to
- 6 go to Mexico, Canada or any other country with low-priced
- 7 prescription drugs and bring them back into the United States;
- 8 therefore be it
- 9 RESOLVED (the Senate concurring), That the General Assembly
- 10 of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania memorialize Congress to pass
- 11 legislation permitting pharmacists and wholesalers to import
- 12 Food and Drug Administration-approved prescription drugs from
- 13 Canada on behalf of their customers in order to pass along the
- 14 cost savings; and be it further
- RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to
- 16 the Honorable George W. Bush, President of the United States,
- 17 the Federal Department of Health and Human Services, the
- 18 presiding officers of each house of Congress and to each member
- 19 of Congress from Pennsylvania.
