## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the week of October 27 through November 3, 2002, as 2 "White Ribbons Against Pornography Week" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Pornography presents youth with a false and
- 4 distorted image of human sexuality, devoid of love, commitment
- 5 and responsibility; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Much pornography features and promotes sexual
- 7 violence and other antisocial behavior in an era of increasing
- 8 sexual violence and an epidemic of sexually transmitted
- 9 diseases; and
- 10 WHEREAS, So-called "adult" pornography is commonly used by
- 11 pedophiles to desensitize children and break down their
- 12 resistance to sexual acts; and
- 13 WHEREAS, There are Federal and State obscenity laws against
- 14 illegal hard-core pornography to protect public safety, public
- 15 health and public morality; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The United States Supreme Court has held that
- 2 obscenity is not protected speech under the First Amendment; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The exploitation and objectification of women and
- 4 children that is indicative of pornographic material must be
- 5 addressed. As a society of individuals, it is our responsibility
- 6 to exercise our rights and maintain the standards that we hold
- 7 dear; therefore be it
- 8 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 9 week of October 27 through November 3, 2002, as "White Ribbons
- 10 Against Pornography Week" in Pennsylvania and encourage the
- 11 display of white ribbons as symbols of support of the
- 12 enforcement of obscenity laws.
