AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An 2 act relating to the public school system, including certain 3 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 4 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the 5 laws relating thereto," providing for weight standards for 6 textbooks. 7 The General Assembly finds and declares as follows: 8 Backpacks of elementary and secondary school pupils 9 often contain textbooks, binders, calculators, personal 10 computers, lunches, a change of clothing, sports equipment 11 and more. Elementary and secondary school pupils are carrying 12 (2)13 backpacks weighing as much as 40 pounds. Chiropractors, physical therapists and pediatricians 14 15 are seeing an increased number of children for spinal column 16 injuries, nontraumatic back pain and significant postural 17 changes from overloaded backpacks.

Chiropractors and pediatricians recommend that

backpacks not exceed more than 15% of a pupil's body weight.

- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 9 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
- 10 section to read:
- 11 <u>Section 801.1. Maximum Weight Standards for Textbooks.--On</u>
- 12 or before July 1, 2005, the State Board of Education shall adopt
- 13 maximum weight standards for textbooks used by pupils in
- 14 elementary and secondary schools. The weight standards shall
- 15 take into consideration the health risks, including, but not
- 16 <u>limited to, injury to the spine, to pupils who transport</u>
- 17 textbooks to and from school each day.
- 18 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
