## AN ACT

8	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania	
9	hereby enacts as follows:	
10	Section 1. Short title.	<
11	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Pennsylvania	
12	Energy Office Act.	
13	Section 2. Definitions.	
14	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall	
15	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the	
	context clearly indicates otherwise:	
17	"Account." The Emergency Energy Assistance Grant Account	

1 established under section 7.

2 "Office." The Pennsylvania Energy Office established under 3 section 3.

4 Section 3. Pennsylvania Energy Office.

5 The Pennsylvania Energy Office is established in the

6 Governor's Office to promote the goals of energy development and

7 energy conservation.

8 Section 4. Composition of office.

9 The Governor shall designate an executive director and hire

10 the staff of the office in accordance with procedures of the

11 Governor's Office of Administration and of the Office of the

12 Budget.

13 Section 5. Advisory Council.

14 The Advisory Council is established. The Governor shall

15 appoint persons to the council who shall be members of the

16 General Assembly, the business and transportation community of

17 this Commonwealth, public officials and the general public. The

18 purpose of the council is to provide advice and assistance to

19 the office on matters affecting the State's energy situation.

20 The members shall be reimbursed for the expense of participating

21 in council functions.

22 Section 6. Powers and duties of office.

23 The powers and duties of the office are as follows:

24 (1) To promote the development of this Commonwealth's 25 indigenous and renewable energy resources through programs 26 involving information and technical and financial assistance. 27 (2) To promote the efficient use of energy by the State 28 government and all sectors of this Commonwealth. Working with 29 the Governor's Green Government Council, the office will 30 encourage energy efficiency and conservation through programs - 2 -20030H0296B4742

providing information and technical and financial assistance.
The office will also work with the Pennsylvania Public
Utility Commission to develop specific programs to promote
energy efficiency for commercial, industrial and residential
consumers of deregulated utilities, such as natural gas and
electricity.

7 (3) To be the point of contact for private and 8 government energy matters and the lead Commonwealth agency 9 for energy policy development. The office will regularly 10 update the Commonwealth's energy policy to determine new 11 opportunities for energy development and energy conservation. 12 (4) To be the primary manager and coordinator of Federal 13 energy grants, petroleum overcharge funds and private energy 14 <del>grants.</del>

15 (5) To assist in the review of energy related plans, programs, policies and regulations of other Commonwealth agencies and to provide recommendations to further promote energy development and energy conservation. The office is authorized to intervene in energy related proceedings of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission and other Federal or State regulatory agencies.

(6) To monitor prices of petroleum and supplies of 22 23 petroleum products available for use in this Commonwealth to 2.4 determine whether there exists or is likely to exist an 25 emergency shortage under section 2802 C(d) of the act of 26 April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative 27 Code of 1929, and to conduct emergency allocation measures 28 during a period of declared emergency petroleum product 29 shortage under section 2802 C of The Administrative Code of 1929. The office will also monitor the price and supply of 30 - 3 -20030H0296B4742

energy to provide information to the Governor on the changing
 impact of energy prices on the Commonwealth's economy.

3 (7) To assume the responsibilities assigned to the 4 Department of Environmental Protection under the act of June 5 28, 1995 (P.L.89, No.18), known as the Conservation and Natural Resources Act, which had been assigned to the 6 Pennsylvania Energy Office under prior statutes, regulations 7 8 and executive orders, including the administration of the 9 funds transferred to the department under section 507 of that 10 act.

11 (8) To promote the establishment of a regional strategic
12 heating oil and diesel fuel reserve in the mid Atlantic
13 states and other programs that ensure that energy shortages
14 or price surges do not harm the Commonwealth's economy.

15 (9) To provide grants to nonprofit entities, municipal authorities, political subdivisions and corporations, limited liability companies or partnerships incorporated or

18 registered in this Commonwealth to help provide emergency

19 energy assistance or weatherization to residents of this

20 Commonwealth.

21 Section 7. Emergency Energy Assistance Grant Account.

22 (a) Establishment. There is hereby established a separate

23 account in the State Treasury to be known as the Emergency

24 Energy Assistance Grant Account. The moneys of the account are

25 hereby appropriated to the Pennsylvania Energy Office to carry

26 out the provisions of this section. The account shall be

27 administered by the office. The account shall consist of that

28 portion of revenues collected under the utilities gross receipts

29 tax collected as set forth in section 8.

30 (b) Expenditures. Moneys from the fund shall be expended by 20030H0296B4742 - 4 - 1 the office as grants to nonprofit entities, municipal

2 authorities, political subdivisions and corporations, limited

3 liability companies or partnerships incorporated or registered

4 in this Commonwealth to help provide emergency energy assistance

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5 or weatherization to residents of this Commonwealth.
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6 Section 8. Allocation from utilities' gross receipts tax.

7 An amount equal to 0.25 mills of the utilities' gross

8 receipts tax collected during each fiscal year under Article XI

9 of the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax

10 Reform Code of 1971, shall be transferred to the account for the

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11 purpose of carrying out the provisions of this act.

12 Section 9. Effective date.

13 This act shall take effect in 60 days.

14 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.

15 AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO 0.25 MILLS OF THE UTILITIES' GROSS RECEIPTS TAX COLLECTED DURING EACH FISCAL YEAR UNDER ARTICLE XI 16 17 OF THE ACT OF MARCH 4, 1971 (P.L.6, NO.2), KNOWN AS THE TAX 18 REFORM CODE OF 1971, SHALL BE APPROPRIATED ANNUALLY FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WELFARE FOR STATE-19 20 FUNDED EMERGENCY ENERGY ASSISTANCE IF THE GOVERNOR DECLARES THAT WEATHER CONDITIONS, NATURAL OR MAN-MADE DISASTERS OR HIGH ENERGY 21 22 PRICES, OR A COMBINATION THEREOF, ARE A THREAT TO PUBLIC HEALTH 23 WITHIN THIS COMMONWEALTH AND AVAILABLE FEDERAL HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE FUNDS ARE NOT SUFFICIENT TO MEET THIS NEED. THE 24 25 GOVERNOR SHALL PUBLISH THIS EMERGENCY DECLARATION IN THE 26 PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN ALONG WITH THE CRITERIA AND EMERGENCY REGULATIONS FOR THIS PROGRAM. 27

28 SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.

29 THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY.
