## AN ACT

- Regulating the licensure of electrical contractors, JOURNEYMAN <—
  ELECTRICIANS AND REGISTERED APPRENTICES; establishing the
  State Board of Examiners of Electrical Contractors and
  providing for its powers and duties; providing penalties; and

- 16 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 17 hereby enacts as follows:
- 18 Section 1. Short title.
- 19 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Electrical
- 20 Contractors Licensing Act.
- 21 Section 2. Definitions.
- The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 23 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 24 context clearly indicates otherwise.
- 25 "Board." The State Board of Examiners of Electrical
- 26 Contractors under the Bureau of Professional and Occupational
- 27 Affairs within the Department of State.
- 28 "Board-approved program." A program of educational
- 29 preparation and training in electrical contracting services
- 30 approved by the Department of Labor and Industry.

- 1 "Commissioner." The Commissioner of Professional and
- 2 Occupational Affairs.
- 3 "Electrical contractor." A person who engages in the
- 4 business of contracting to install, erect, repair, REMOVE,
- 5 DEMOLISH or alter electrical equipment for the generation,
- 6 transmission or AND SYSTEMS IN STRUCTURES AND PREMISES FOR THE <-

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- 7 GENERATION, TRANSMISSION, utilization of electrical energy,
- 8 INCLUDING INTELLIGENCE, COMMUNICATION AND LIGHT, THROUGH
- 9 CONDUCTORS OR OPTICAL FIBER.
- "Employ," "employed," "employee" and "employment." These
- 11 terms shall apply to the relationship of independent contractor
- 12 as well as to the relationship of employment.
- "Journeyman electrician." An individual employed by an
- 14 electrical contractor to perform electrical construction and
- 15 installation services.
- 16 "Person." A natural person, firm, corporation or other legal
- 17 entity.
- 18 "Practice of electrical contracting." Holding oneself out to
- 19 the public by any title or description of services incorporating
- 20 the term "licensed electrical contractor" or using any words or
- 21 symbols indicating or tending to indicate that the person is a
- 22 licensed electrical contractor and, under such description,
- 23 offering to contract or contracting to install, erect, repair,
- 24 MAINTAIN, REMOVE, DEMOLISH or alter electrical equipment for the
- 25 generation, transmission or AND SYSTEMS IN STRUCTURES AND
- 26 PREMISES FOR THE GENERATION, TRANSMISSION, utilization of
- 27 electrical energy, INCLUDING INTELLIGENCE, COMMUNICATION AND <-
- 28 LIGHT, THROUGH CONDUCTORS OR OPTICAL FIBER.
- 29 "Registered apprentice." A State-licensed individual who is
- 30 employed by an electrical contractor and who meets the

- 1 requirements of this act AND THE PENNSYLVANIA BUREAU OF
- 2 APPRENTICESHIP TRAINING to be issued an apprenticeship permit.
- 3 "SERVICE POINT." THE POINT OF CONNECTION BETWEEN THE
- 4 FACILITIES OF THE SERVING UTILITY AND THE PREMISES' WIRING.
- 5 "State-licensed electrical contractor." An electrical
- 6 contractor who holds a current license under this act and who
- 7 engages in the practice of electrical contracting.
- 8 "State-licensed journeyman electrician." An individual
- 9 employed by a State-licensed electrical contractor who holds a
- 10 current license under this act to perform electrical
- 11 construction and installation services.
- 12 Section 3. State Board of Examiners of Electrical Contractors.
- 13 (a) Establishment.--There is hereby established the State
- 14 Board of Examiners of Electrical Contractors, a departmental
- 15 administrative board in the Department of State. The board shall
- 16 consist of 11 members who are citizens of the United States and
- 17 who have been residents of this Commonwealth for a two-year
- 18 period, two of whom shall be public members, six of whom shall
- 19 be qualified electrical contractors with experience of not less
- 20 than ten years as an electrical contractor, one of whom shall be
- 21 a qualified electrical inspector with experience of not less
- 22 than five years as an electrical inspector, one of whom shall be
- 23 the Commissioner of the Bureau of Professional and Occupational
- 24 Affairs, and one of whom shall be the Director of the Bureau of
- 25 Consumer Protection in the Office of Attorney General, or his
- 26 designee. Three of the electrical contractor members shall be
- 27 signatories to collective bargaining agreements and the
- 28 remaining three shall be nonsignatories.
- 29 (b) Terms of office.--The members shall serve for four-year
- 30 terms, except as provided in subsection (c)., and shall be

- 1 appointed by the Governor and with the advice and consent of a
- 2 majority of the members elected to the Senate.
- 3 (c) Initial appointments. -- Within 90 days of the effective
- 4 date of this act, the Governor shall nominate two electrical
- 5 contractors and one public member to serve four-year terms; two
- 6 electrical contractors and one electrical inspector to serve
- 7 three-year terms; and two electrical contractors and one public
- 8 member to serve two-year terms.
- 9 (d) Continuation in office.--Each board member shall
- 10 continue in office until a successor is duly appointed and
- 11 qualified but no longer than six months after the expiration of
- 12 the term. In the event that a board member dies, resigns or
- 13 otherwise becomes disqualified during the term of office, a
- 14 successor shall be appointed in the same way and with the same
- 15 qualifications as set forth in this section and shall hold
- 16 office for the unexpired portion of the unexpired term.
- 17 (e) Limit on terms. -- No board member shall be eliqible for
- 18 appointment to serve more than two consecutive four-year terms.
- 19 (f) Forfeiture of membership.--A board member who fails to
- 20 attend three consecutive meetings shall forfeit that member's
- 21 seat unless the commissioner, upon written request from the
- 22 member, finds that the member shall be excused from a meeting
- 23 because of illness or the death of a family member.
- 24 (g) Compensation. -- Each member of the board, except the
- 25 commissioner, and the Director of the Bureau of Consumer
- 26 Protection, shall receive \$60 per diem when actually attending
- 27 to the work of the board. Members shall also receive reasonable
- 28 traveling, hotel and other necessary expenses incurred in the
- 29 performance of their duties in accordance with Commonwealth
- 30 regulations.

- 1 (h) Forfeiture for nonattendance.--A public member who fails
- 2 to attend two consecutive statutorily mandated training seminars
- 3 in accordance with section 813(e) of the act of April 9, 1929
- 4 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929,
- 5 shall forfeit that public member's seat unless the commissioner,
- 6 upon written request from the public member, finds that the
- 7 public member should be excused from a meeting because of
- 8 illness or the death of a family member.
- 9 (i) Quorum.--A majority of the members serving in accordance
- 10 with law shall constitute a quorum for purposes of conducting
- 11 the business of the board. Except for temporary and automatic
- 12 suspensions, a member may not be counted as part of a quorum or
- 13 vote on any issue unless that member is physically in attendance
- 14 at the meeting.
- 15 (j) Meetings.--The board shall meet at least four times a
- 16 year in Harrisburg.
- 17 (k) Notice. -- Reasonable notice of all meetings shall be
- 18 given in conformity with 65 Pa.C.S. Ch. 7 (relating to open
- 19 meetings).
- 20 (1) Operating procedures. -- The board shall meet within 30
- 21 days after the appointment of initial members and set up
- 22 operating procedures and application forms for licensing
- 23 electrical contractors and journeyman electricians, and for
- 24 issuing registration permits to apprentices. It shall be the
- 25 responsibility of the board to circulate these forms and educate
- 26 the public to the requirements of licensing in order to hold
- 27 oneself out as a State-licensed electrical contractor OR A
- 28 STATE-LICENSED JOURNEYMAN ELECTRICIAN within this Commonwealth.

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- 29 Section 4. Powers and functions of board.
- The board shall have the following powers:

- 1 (1) To pass upon the qualifications and fitness of
  2 applicants for licenses and reciprocal licenses and to adopt
  3 and revise rules and regulations requiring applicants to pass
  4 examinations relating to their qualifications as a
  5 prerequisite to the issuance of a license.
  - (2) To adopt and, from time to time, revise those rules and regulations as may be necessary to carry into effect provisions of this act. The regulations shall include, but shall not be limited to, standards of professional practice and conduct for licenses and registrations issued under this act.
    - (3) To examine for, deny, approve, issue, revoke, suspend or renew licenses and registrations authorized pursuant to this act and to conduct hearings in connection therewith.
    - (4) To conduct hearings upon complaints concerning violations of this act and the rules and regulations adopted pursuant to this act and seek the prosecution and enjoinder of all such violations.
    - (5) To expend moneys necessary to the proper carrying out of its assigned duties.
  - (6) To waive examination and grant a license in cases deemed exceptional by the board and in accordance with regulations promulgated by the board.
- 25 (7) To submit annually a report, to the Consumer
  26 Protection and Professional Licensure Committee of the Senate
  27 and the Professional Licensure Committee of the House of
  28 Representatives, containing a description of the complaints
  29 received, status of the cases, board action which has been
  30 taken and length of time from the initial complaint to final

- board resolution.
- 2 (8) To submit annually to the Appropriation Committee of
- 3 the Senate and the Appropriation Committee of the House of
- 4 Representatives, 15 days after the Governor has submitted the
- budget to the General Assembly, a copy of the budget request
- for the upcoming fiscal year which the board previously
- 7 submitted to the Department of State.
- 8 Section 5. License required.
- 9 (A) GENERAL RULE. -- It shall be unlawful for any person to
- 10 hold himself forth as a State-licensed electrical contractor
- 11 unless that person shall first have obtained a license in
- 12 accordance with this act. The licensee shall assume full
- 13 responsibility for inspection and supervision of all electrical
- 14 work to be performed in accordance with recognized safety
- 15 standards adopted by regulation of the board.
- 16 (B) LICENSING OR REGISTRATION REQUIRED. -- IT SHALL BE
- 17 UNLAWFUL FOR A PERSON TO PERFORM WORK AS DESCRIBED IN THE
- 18 DEFINITION OF "PRACTICE OF ELECTRICAL CONTRACTING" UNLESS THE
- 19 PERSON IS A STATE-LICENSED ELECTRICAL CONTRACTOR, STATE-LICENSED

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- 20 JOURNEYMAN ELECTRICIAN OR REGISTERED APPRENTICE UNDER THIS ACT.
- 21 Section 6. Qualifications for license.
- 22 (a) Electrical contractor's license. -- No person shall be
- 23 granted an electrical contractor's license under this act or
- 24 hold himself out as a State-licensed electrical contractor
- 25 unless that person submits proof satisfactory to the board of
- 26 the following:
- 27 (1) Good moral character.
- 28 (2) The person has been employed or engaged in the
- 29 business of electrical construction and installation or has
- 30 equivalent practical experience for a period of not less than

- five years preceding the time of the application, or shall
- otherwise demonstrate, pursuant to regulations of the board,
- a combination of education and experience, which may include
- 4 the acquisition of a journeyman electrician's license, which
- 5 qualifies the person to take the examination for a license.
- 6 (3) Payment of the appropriate fees.
- 7 (4) Passage of the required examination.
- 8 (b) Journeyman electrician license. -- An employee of a State-
- 9 licensed electrical contractor who performs and WORK WITHIN THE

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- 10 DEFINITION OF "PRACTICE OF ELECTRICAL CONTRACTING" OR supervises
- 11 electrical construction and installation services and who does
- 12 not qualify OR DOES NOT DESIRE to take the ELECTRICAL CONTRACTOR
- 13 examination required under subsection (a) shall apply to the
- 14 board for a license as a journeyman electrician. A person may be
- 15 granted a license as a journeyman electrician if that person
- 16 submits proof satisfactory to the board of the following:
- 17 (1) Good moral character.
- 18 (2) The completion of a board-approved program or at
- 19 least four years' practical experience acceptable to the
- 20 board as a registered apprentice which qualifies him or her
- 21 to take the examination.
- 22 (3) Payment of the appropriate fees.
- 23 (4) Passage of the required examination.
- 24 Section 7. Apprenticeship permit.
- 25 (a) Permit required.--A person employed by a State-licensed
- 26 electrical contractor who does not qualify for AND OBTAIN the
- 27 journeyman license UNDER THIS ACT shall register with the board <---
- 28 AND THE PENNSYLVANIA BUREAU OF APPRENTICESHIP TRAINING and
- 29 obtain the AN apprenticeship permit. An apprenticeship permit
- 30 authorizes the holder to assist a State-licensed electrical

- contractor or State-licensed journeyman electrician for purposes
- of training and instruction. 2
- 3 (b) Requirement for permit. -- State-licensed electrical
- 4 contractors shall submit annually to the board a report listing
- 5 the name, address, Social Security number and period of
- employment of all apprentices in their employ. Work performed by 6
- the holder of an apprenticeship permit shall be performed only 7
- under the direct, onsite supervision of a State-licensed 8
- electrical contractor or State-licensed journeyman electrician.
- 10 Application shall be made within 30 days of employment to
- 11 perform electrical work.
- 12 (c) Renewal and education. -- Apprentices registered with the
- 13 board may enroll in a board-approved program of instruction
- 14 WHICH MEETS THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE PENNSYLVANIA BUREAU OF
- 15 APPRENTICESHIP TRAINING. Permits shall be renewed annually upon

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- 16 payment of the required fee. State-licensed electrical
- 17 contractors shall document, pursuant to board regulations, that
- 18 registered apprentices in their employ receive instruction in
- 19 current requirements of the National Electrical Code.
- Section 8. Examination required. 20
- 21 (a) General rule. -- The board may require an applicant for a
- 22 license to take and pass an examination to the satisfaction of
- 23 the board. The board shall contract with a professional testing
- 24 service for the preparation, development, administration and
- 25 grading of the examination. Written, oral and practical
- 26 examinations shall be prepared and administered by a qualified
- 27 and approved professional testing organization in the manner
- 28 prescribed under section 812.1 of the act of April 9, 1929
- (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929. 29
- 30 (b) Exemption from examination. -- The requirements of

- 1 subsection (a) shall not apply and a license shall be issued
- 2 without examination to an individual who submits an application
- 3 for license, accompanied by the required fee, within two years
- 4 of the effective date of this act, who is a resident of this
- 5 Commonwealth, who submits proof of being employed or engaged in
- 6 the business of electrical contracting within this Commonwealth
- 7 for a period of at least six years prior to the effective date
- 8 of this act and who demonstrates, to the satisfaction of the
- 9 board, that his or her principal business or employment, for at
- 10 least two years immediately preceding the date of application,
- 11 was that of an electrical contractor or a journeyman
- 12 electrician.
- 13 Section 9. Reciprocity.
- 14 The board shall have the power to grant a reciprocal license
- 15 to an applicant who is licensed or certified as an electrical
- 16 contractor or journeyman electrician in another state and who
- 17 demonstrates qualifications which equal or exceed those required
- 18 pursuant to this act in the determination of the board, provided
- 19 that no license shall be granted under this section to an
- 20 applicant unless the state in which the applicant is licensed
- 21 affords reciprocal treatment to persons who are residents of
- 22 this Commonwealth and who are licensed pursuant to this act.
- 23 Section 10. Continuing education.
- 24 The board may promulgate regulations establishing continuing
- 25 education to be met by individuals seeking to renew licenses
- 26 issued under this act. State-licensed electrical contractors and
- 27 State-licensed journeymen electricians shall, during the two-
- 28 year period immediately preceding biennial renewal of licenses
- 29 issued under this act, complete a AN EIGHT-HOUR program of
- 30 continuing education in the requirements of the National

- 1 Electrical Code, as defined by and acceptable to the board,
- 2 except that no credit may be given for courses in office
- 3 management or practice building.
- 4 Section 11. Refusal, suspension and revocation of license.
- 5 (a) Grounds.--The board may refuse, suspend, revoke, limit
- 6 or restrict a license or issue a public reprimand for any of the
- 7 following:
- 8 (1) Securing a license by fraud, deceit or
- 9 misrepresentation.
- 10 (2) Being unfit or unable to engage in electrical
- 11 contracting by reason of illness, drunkenness, excessive use
- of drugs, narcotics, chemicals or any other type of material,
- or as a result of any mental or physical condition. In
- enforcing this paragraph, the board shall, upon probable
- cause, have authority to compel a licensee to submit to a
- mental or physical examination by a physician approved by the
- 17 board. Failure to submit to such examination when directed by
- the board, unless such failure is due to circumstances beyond
- 19 the control of the licensee, shall constitute an admission of
- the allegations against the licensee, consequent upon which a
- 21 default and final order may be entered without the taking of
- 22 testimony or presentation of evidence. A licensee affected
- 23 under this paragraph shall at reasonable intervals, as
- determined by the board, be afforded an opportunity to
- demonstrate that the licensee can resume the competent
- 26 practice of electrical contracting with reasonable skill and
- 27 safety.
- 28 (3) Engaging in false, deceptive or fraudulent business
- 29 activities or in misleading advertising.
- 30 (4) Violating a provision of this act or regulations of

1 the board.

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- 2 (5) Committing an act of negligence or incompetence or authorizing such an act by an employee.
- 4 (6) Failing to properly supervise employees in
  5 accordance with this act and, with recognized electrical <—
  6 safety standards of, AND WITH the National Electrical Code in <—
  7 effect at the time an act is committed, or authorizing an
  8 unlicensed individual to assume responsibility for
  9 supervisory work.
- 10 (7) Failing to secure an inspection of electrical construction as required by law.
  - (8) Failing to perform electrical construction in conformance with standards in effect in the municipality wherein the services were performed or, in the absence of such standards, in conformance with standards of the National Electrical Code.
  - (9) Failing to comply with a municipal ordinance concerning the inspection of electrical work and services, or the manner in which the municipality requires electrical work to be performed.
- Being convicted of a felony in the courts of any 21 jurisdiction, or being convicted of a OR misdemeanor related 22 23 to electrical contracting in any jurisdiction. As used in 24 this section, the term "convicted" includes a finding or 25 verdict of guilt, an admission of guilt or a plea of nolo 26 contendere, or receiving probation without verdict, 27 disposition in lieu of trial or an accelerated rehabilitative 28 disposition in the disposition of felony charges.
- 29 (11) Having a license to perform electrical contracting 30 or electrical construction services suspended, revoked or

- 1 refused or receiving other disciplinary action by the proper
- licensing authority of any other state, territory, possession
- 3 or country.
- 4 (b) Board action. -- When the board finds that the license or
- 5 application for license of any person may be refused, revoked,
- 6 restricted or suspended under the terms of subsection (a), the
- 7 board may:
- 8 (1) Deny the application for a license.
- 9 (2) Administer a public reprimand.
- 10 (3) Revoke, suspend, limit or otherwise restrict a
- license as determined by the board.
- 12 (4) Suspend enforcement of its findings thereof and
- 13 place a licensee on probation with the right to vacate the
- 14 probationary order for noncompliance.
- 15 (5) Restore a suspended license and impose any
- disciplinary or corrective measure which it might originally
- 17 have imposed.
- 18 (c) Hearing. -- All actions of the board shall be taken
- 19 subject to the right of notice, hearing and adjudication and the
- 20 right of appeal therefrom in accordance with 2 Pa.C.S. (relating
- 21 to administrative law and procedure).
- 22 (d) Temporary suspension.--
- 23 (1) The board shall temporarily suspend a license under
- 24 circumstances as determined by the board to be an immediate
- and clear danger to the public health and safety. The board
- 26 shall issue an order to that effect without a hearing, but
- 27 upon due notice to the licensee concerned at the licensee's
- last known address, which shall include a written statement
- of all allegations against the licensee. The provisions of
- 30 subsection (c) shall not apply to temporary suspension.

- 1 (2) The board shall thereupon commence formal action to
- 2 suspend, revoke or restrict the license of the person
- 3 concerned as otherwise provided for in this act. All actions
- 4 shall be taken promptly and without delay.
- 5 (3) Within 30 days following the issuance of an order
- 6 temporarily suspending a license, the board shall conduct, or
- 7 cause to be conducted, a preliminary hearing to determine if
- 8 there is a prima facie case supporting the suspension. The
- 9 licensee whose license has been temporarily suspended may be
- 10 present at the preliminary hearing and may be represented by
- 11 counsel, cross-examine witnesses, inspect physical evidence,
- 12 call witnesses, offer evidence and testimony and make a
- 13 record of the proceedings.
- 14 (4) If it is determined that there is not a prima facie
- case, the suspended license shall be immediately restored.
- 16 The temporary suspension shall remain in effect until vacated
- by the board but in no event longer than 180 days.
- 18 (e) Automatic suspension. -- A license issued under this act
- 19 shall automatically be suspended upon the legal commitment of a
- 20 licensee to an institution because of mental incompetence from
- 21 any cause upon filing with the board a certified copy of the
- 22 commitment, conviction of a felony under the act of April 14,
- 23 1972 (P.L.233, No.64), known as The Controlled Substance, Drug,
- 24 Device and Cosmetic Act, or conviction of an offense under the
- 25 laws of another jurisdiction, which, if committed in this
- 26 Commonwealth, would be a felony under The Controlled Substance,
- 27 Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act. As used in this section, the term
- 28 "conviction" shall include a judgment, an admission of guilt or
- 29 a plea of nolo contendere. Automatic suspension under this
- 30 section shall not be stayed pending an appeal of conviction.

- 1 Restoration of the license shall be made as provided in this act
- 2 for revocation or suspension of the license.
- 3 Section 12. Reinstatement of license.
- 4 Unless otherwise ordered to do so by Commonwealth Court or an
- 5 appeal therefrom, the board shall not reinstate the revoked
- 6 license of a person to practice as a State-licensed electrical
- 7 contractor or State-licensed journeyman electrician pursuant to
- 8 this act. Any person whose license has been revoked may apply
- 9 for reinstatement, after a period of at least five years, but
- 10 must meet all of the licensing qualifications of this act,
- 11 including the examination requirement, if the person desires to
- 12 practice as a State-licensed electrical contractor or State-
- 13 licensed journeyman electrician pursuant to this act at any time
- 14 after the revocation.
- 15 Section 13. Reporting of multiple licensure.
- 16 Any State-licensed electrical contractor or State-licensed
- 17 journeyman electrician in this Commonwealth who is also licensed
- 18 in any other state, territory or country shall report this
- 19 information to the board on the biennial renewal application.
- 20 Any disciplinary action taken in any other state, territory or
- 21 country shall be reported to the board on the biennial renewal
- 22 application, or within 90 days of disposition, whichever is
- 23 sooner. Multiple licensure shall be noted by the board on the
- 24 licensee's record, and the state, territory or country shall be
- 25 notified by the board of any disciplinary actions taken against
- 26 the licensee in this Commonwealth.
- 27 Section 14. Surrender of suspended or revoked license.
- The board shall require a person whose license has been
- 29 suspended or revoked to return the license in a manner as the
- 30 board directs. Failure to do so shall be a misdemeanor of the

- 1 third degree.
- 2 Section 15. Death or disability of State-licensed electrical
- 3 contractor.
- 4 A licensed STATE-LICENSED journeyman shall be permitted to

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- 5 perform electrical services necessary to complete any jobs in
- 6 progress at the time of the death or disability of an electrical
- 7 contractor. The board shall promulgate regulations establishing
- 8 conditions under which contracted electrical services may be
- 9 provided by an electrical contractor business in the event of
- 10 the death, illness or disability of the State-licensed
- 11 electrical contractor in responsible charge of the services
- 12 provided by the business.
- 13 Section 16. Transferability of license.
- 14 No license or registration issued under this act shall be
- 15 assignable or transferable. No person licensed or registered
- 16 under this act shall permit any other person to use such license
- 17 or registration for any purpose inconsistent with this act. A
- 18 finding by the board that a person licensed or registered under
- 19 this act has allowed any other person to use such license or
- 20 registration to perform electrical work, acquire a permit to
- 21 perform electrical work, or otherwise hold himself out as a
- 22 person licensed or registered under this act shall be grounds
- 23 for revocation.
- 24 Section 17. Powers of municipalities.
- 25 (a) Municipal ordinances preserved.--
- 26 (1) Nothing in this act shall be construed to supersede
- 27 the power of a municipality to inspect electrical work or
- 28 equipment <del>or to</del>, regulate the manner in which electrical work
- 29 shall be performed to, DEVELOP AND ENFORCE LOCAL CODES, levy <-
- 30 lawful taxes and fees, and to AND require the purchase of a <--

- 1 business privilege license unrelated to competence in the
- 2 practice of electrical contracting.
- 3 (2) No municipality shall require a licensee licensed
- 4 under this act to obtain a municipal license to engage in
- 5 electrical contracting in the municipality.
- 6 (3) Nothing in this act shall be construed to preclude
- 7 municipalities from denying or revoking local permits for
- 8 failure to comply with local ordinances not inconsistent with
- 9 this act or regulations of the board.
- 10 (b) Failure to comply with local ordinance. -- A licensee who
- 11 fails to comply with a municipal ordinance concerning the
- 12 inspection of electrical work and services or the manner in
- 13 which the municipality requires electrical work to be performed
- 14 shall be subject to disciplinary proceedings under this act.
- 15 Section 18. Local rulemaking.
- 16 Licensure under this act shall be acceptable to any
- 17 municipality in this Commonwealth as proof of competence to
- 18 perform electrical contracting services. No municipality may
- 19 require a licensee licensed under this act to obtain an
- 20 additional license as an electrical contractor issued by that
- 21 municipality prior to contracting to perform services in any
- 22 municipality.
- 23 Section 19. License renewal; records and fees.
- 24 (a) Renewal term. -- The renewal of a license shall be on a
- 25 biennial basis.
- 26 (b) Records.--A record of all persons licensed to practice
- 27 as State-licensed electrical contractors or State-licensed
- 28 journeyman electricians in this Commonwealth shall be kept in
- 29 the office of the board and shall be open to public inspection
- 30 and copying upon payment of a nominal fee for copying the

- 1 record.
- 2 (c) Fees.--
- 3 (1) All fees required pursuant to this act shall be
- 4 fixed by the board by regulation and shall be subject to the
- 5 act of June 25, 1982 (P.L.633, No.181), known as the
- 6 Regulatory Review Act. If the revenues raised by fees, fines
- 7 and civil penalties imposed pursuant to this act are not
- 8 sufficient to meet expenditures over a two-year period, the
- 9 board shall increase those fees by regulation so that the
- 10 projected revenues will meet or exceed projected
- 11 expenditures.
- 12 (2) If the Bureau of Professional and Occupational
- 13 Affairs determines that the fees established by the board
- 14 pursuant to paragraph (1) are inadequate to meet the minimum
- enforcement efforts required by this act, then the bureau,
- after consultation with the board and subject to the
- 17 Regulatory Review Act, shall increase the fees by regulation
- in an amount so that adequate revenues are raised to meet the
- 19 required enforcement effort.
- 20 Section 20. Subpoenas.
- 21 (a) Power to issue. -- The board shall have the authority to
- 22 issue subpoenas, upon application of an attorney responsible for
- 23 representing the Commonwealth in disciplinary matters before the
- 24 board, for the purpose of investigating alleged violations of
- 25 disciplinary provisions administered by the board. The board
- 26 shall have the power to subpoena witnesses, to administer oaths,
- 27 to examine witnesses and to take testimony or compel the
- 28 production of those books, records, papers and documents as it
- 29 may deem necessary or proper in, and pertinent to, any
- 30 proceeding, investigation or hearing held or had by it. Client

- 1 records may not be subpoenaed without consent of the client or
- 2 without order of a court of competent jurisdiction on a showing
- 3 that the records are reasonably necessary for the conduct of the
- 4 investigation. The court may impose such limitations on the
- 5 scope of the subpoena as are necessary to prevent unnecessary
- 6 intrusion into client confidential information. The board may
- 7 apply to Commonwealth Court to enforce its subpoenas.
- 8 (b) Notification of board. -- An attorney responsible for
- 9 representing the Commonwealth in disciplinary matters before the
- 10 board shall notify the board immediately upon receiving
- 11 notification of an alleged violation of this act. The board
- 12 shall maintain current records of all reports of alleged
- 13 violations and periodically review the records for the purpose
- 14 of determining that each alleged violation has been resolved in
- 15 a timely manner.
- 16 Section 21. Unlawful practice.
- 17 (a) Unlawful practice prohibited.--It shall be unlawful for
- 18 any person to hold himself out as a State-licensed electrical
- 19 contractor or State-licensed journeyman electrician without
- 20 possessing a valid, unexpired, unrevoked and unsuspended license
- 21 issued under this act.
- 22 (b) Injunction.--Unlawful practice may be enjoined by the
- 23 courts upon petition of the commissioner or the board. In any
- 24 proceeding under this section, it shall not be necessary to show
- 25 that any person is individually injured by the actions
- 26 complained of. If the court finds that the respondent has
- 27 violated this section, it shall enjoin the respondent from so
- 28 practicing until the respondent has been duly licensed.
- 29 Procedure in such cases shall be the same as in any other
- 30 injunction suit.

- 1 (c) Remedy cumulative. -- The injunctive remedy provided in
- 2 this section shall be in addition to any other civil or criminal
- 3 prosecution and punishment.
- 4 Section 22. Penalties.
- 5 (a) Criminal penalty.--A person who violates this act
- 6 commits a misdemeanor of the third degree and shall, upon
- 7 conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of up to \$1,000 or to
- 8 imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or both.
- 9 (b) Civil penalty. -- In addition to any other civil remedy or
- 10 criminal penalty provided for in this act, the board, by a vote
- 11 of the majority of the maximum number of the authorized
- 12 membership of the board as provided by law, or by a vote of the
- 13 majority of the duly qualified and confirmed membership or a
- 14 minimum of three members, whichever is greater, may levy a civil
- 15 penalty of up to \$1,000 on any current licensee who violates any
- 16 provision of this act or on any person who holds himself out as
- 17 a State-licensed electrical contractor or State-licensed
- 18 journeyman electrician without being so licensed pursuant to
- 19 this act. The board shall levy this penalty only after affording
- 20 the accused party the opportunity for a hearing, as provided in
- 21 2 Pa.C.S. (relating to administrative law and procedure).
- 22 (c) Disposition.--All fines and civil penalties imposed in
- 23 accordance with this section shall be paid into the Professional
- 24 Licensure Augmentation Account.
- 25 Section 23. Exemption.
- 26 Electrical work done by or for an electric public utility, an
- 27 electric cooperative corporation or a municipal electric system
- 28 shall not be included within the practice of electrical
- 29 contracting when such work is performed on plant or equipment
- 30 used in the generation, transmission and distribution of

- 1 electricity, INCLUDING INTELLIGENCE, COMMUNICATION AND LIGHT
- 2 THROUGH CONDUCTORS OR OPTICAL FIBER, to the public up to the
- 3 SERVICE point at which electrical current is metered for billing <-

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- 4 purposes.
- 5 Section 24. Appropriation.
- 6 The sum of \$85,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary,
- 7 is hereby appropriated from the Professional Licensure
- 8 Augmentation Account within the General Fund to the Bureau of
- 9 Professional and Occupational Affairs in the Department of
- 10 State, for the payment of costs of processing licenses and
- 11 renewals, for the operation of the board and for other general
- 12 costs of the bureau operations relating to this act. The
- 13 appropriation granted shall be repaid by the board within three
- 14 years of the beginning of issuance of licenses by the board.
- 15 Section 25. Severability.
- 16 The provisions of this act are severable. If any provision of
- 17 this act or its application to any person or circumstance is
- 18 held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions
- 19 or applications of this act which can be given effect without
- 20 the invalid provision or application.
- 21 Section 26. Effective date.
- 22 This act shall take effect as follows:
- 23 (1) Sections 5 and 21 shall take effect in 24 months.
- 24 (2) The remainder of this act shall take effect in 90
- 25 days.
