## AN ACT

Amending the act of March 20, 2003 (P.L. , No.1A), entitled 1 2 "An act to provide from the General Fund for the expenses of 3 the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the 4 Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for 5 the fiscal year July 1, 2003, to June 30, 2004, for certain 6 institutions and organizations, and for the payment of bills 7 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year 8 ending June 30, 2003; to provide appropriations from the 9 State Lottery Fund, the Energy Conservation and Assistance Fund, the Hazardous Material Response Fund, The State Stores 10 Fund, the Milk Marketing Fund, the Home Investment Trust 11 12 Fund, the Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund, the 13 Tuition Payment Fund, the Banking Department Fund, the 14 Firearm Records Check Fund, the Ben Franklin Technology 15 Development Authority Fund and the Tobacco Settlement Fund to the Executive Department; to provide appropriations from the 16 Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account to the Judicial 17 18 Department for the fiscal year July 1, 2003, to June 30, 19 2004; to provide appropriations from the Motor License Fund 20 for the fiscal year July 1, 2003, to June 30, 2004, for the proper operation of the several departments of the 21 22 Commonwealth and the Pennsylvania State Police authorized to 23 spend Motor License Fund moneys; to provide for the 24 appropriation of Federal funds to the Executive Department of 25 the Commonwealth and for the establishment of restricted receipt accounts for the fiscal year July 1, 2003, to June 26 27 30, 2004, and for the payment of bills remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003; to provide 28 for the additional appropriation of Federal and State funds 29

from the General Fund, for the Executive Department of the 1 Commonwealth for the fiscal year July 1, 2002, to June 30, 2 2003, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining 3 unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2002; 4 and making a repeal, " increasing the State appropriations for 5 6 the State System of Higher Education. 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 8 9 Section 1. Section 227 of the act of March 20, 2003 (P.L. , No.1A), known as the General Appropriation Act of 2003, is 10 amended to read: 11 12 Section 227. State System of 13 Higher Education. -- The following 14 amounts are appropriated to the State 15 System of Higher Education: Federal State For the State System of Higher 16 Education, including the Chancellor's 17 18 Office. 19 The State System of Higher 20 Education shall report its financial 21 statements in accordance with 22 generally accepted accounting 23 principles as prescribed by the 24 National Association of College and University Business Officers, the 25 American Institute of Certified Public 26 27 Accountants or any other recognized authoritative body, as well as 28 29 applicable policy and standards 30 promulgated by the Commonwealth and 31 the Federal Government. 32 417,222,000] [State appropriation.....
