## AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of June 24, 1976 (P.L.424, No.101), entitled,
- as amended, "An act providing for the payment of death
- benefits to the surviving spouse or children or parents of
- firefighters, ambulance service or rescue squad members, law enforcement officers or National Guard members killed in the
- 6 performance of their duties," extending benefits to members
- 7 of certain hazardous material response teams.
- 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 9 hereby enacts as follows:
- 10 Section 1. Section 2 of the act of June 24, 1976 (P.L.424,
- 11 No.101), referred to as the Emergency and Law Enforcement
- 12 Personnel Death Benefits Act, amended October 16, 1981 (P.L.295,
- 13 No.102), is amended to read:
- 14 Section 2. "Firefighter, ambulance service or rescue squad
- 15 member or law enforcement officer" means a firefighter, member
- 16 of a volunteer fire company, member of an ambulance service or
- 17 rescue squad, peace officer as defined in 18 Pa.C.S. § 501

- 1 (relating to definitions), public servant concerned in official
- 2 detention as defined in 18 Pa.C.S. § 5121 (relating to escape),
- 3 an officer or employee of a State correctional institution,
- 4 guards or employees of county jails and prisons, member of a
- 5 <u>certified hazardous material response team that is not-for-</u>
- 6 profit or other law enforcement officer of the Commonwealth of
- 7 Pennsylvania or of any political subdivision thereof.
- 8 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
