A RESOLUTION

1 Amending the Rules of the House of Representatives, further 2 providing for the general appropriation bill and for non-3 preferred bills. 4 RESOLVED, That Rule 19(b) of the Rules of the House of Representatives be amended to read as follows: 5 [RULE 19 (b) 6 7 General Appropriation Bill and Non-Preferred Bills 8 This rule shall apply to all amendments offered to the 9 General Appropriation Bill for each proposed fiscal year 10 including any amendments offered to or for supplemental 11 appropriations to prior fiscal years contained within the General Appropriation Bill, and shall also apply to all 12 13 amendments offered to any non-preferred appropriation bill for 14 the same fiscal year. 15 Any amendment offered on the floor of the House to the 16 General Appropriation Bill that proposes to increase spending of 17 State dollars for the Commonwealth's proposed fiscal year or

prior fiscal years above the levels contained in the General

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- 1 Appropriation Bill as reported from the Appropriations Committee
- 2 plus any aggregate if certified each year by the Appropriations
- 3 Committee shall not be in order and may not be considered unless
- 4 the same amendment contains sufficient reductions in line items
- 5 of that General Appropriation Bill so that the amendment offered
- 6 does not result in a net increase in the total proposed spending
- 7 contained within the General Appropriation Bill plus any
- 8 aggregate if certified by the Appropriations Committee.
- 9 Any amendment offered on the floor of the House to any non-
- 10 preferred appropriation bill that proposes to increase spending
- 11 of State dollars for the current fiscal year above the levels
- 12 contained in that non-preferred appropriation bill as reported
- 13 from the Appropriations Committee shall not be in order and may
- 14 not be considered unless the same amendment contains sufficient
- 15 reductions in that non-preferred appropriation bill so that the
- 16 amendment offered does not result in a net increase in the total
- 17 proposed spending contained within that non-preferred
- 18 appropriation bill.
- 19 In order to be considered, amendments to the General
- 20 Appropriation Bill must be submitted to the Office of the Chief
- 21 Clerk by 2:00 P.M. of the Monday of the week prior to the
- 22 scheduled vote of the General Appropriation Bill. The
- 23 Appropriations Committee for special and proper reason and by
- 24 majority vote, may waive this deadline. Members shall be
- 25 notified of the scheduled vote on the General Appropriation Bill
- 26 no later than 4:30 P.M. of the Wednesday preceding the above
- 27 noted Monday on which the amendments must be filed to the Bill.
- 28 Rule 21 of the Rules of the House, insofar as it applies to the
- 29 filing deadline for amendments and notice requirements for the
- 30 voting schedule for the General Appropriation Bill, shall not

- 1 apply to this rule. Rule 21 shall, however, apply to the non-
- 2 preferred appropriation bills.
- 3 If the amendment cannot be submitted in accordance with the
- 4 provision of the previous paragraph because it is still being
- 5 prepared by the Legislative Reference Bureau, the member must,
- 6 by 2:00 P.M. on the Monday of the week prior to the scheduled
- 7 vote, provide the Office of the Chief Clerk with a statement,
- 8 prepared by the member containing the factual content and exact
- 9 amounts of increases and decreases in line items which would be
- 10 proposed in the amendment, along with certification from the
- 11 Legislative Reference Bureau that the amendment was submitted to
- 12 the Legislative Reference Bureau prior to 2:00 P.M. on the
- 13 aforementioned Monday. This filing deadline does not apply to
- 14 amendments to any non-preferred appropriation bill.
- Debate on any debatable question related to the General
- 16 Appropriation Bill shall be limited to five minutes each time a
- 17 member is recognized. On the bill a sponsor of an amendment
- 18 shall be entitled to be recognized twice, a maker of a debatable
- 19 motion shall be entitled to be recognized twice, any other
- 20 members shall be entitled to be recognized once.
- 21 This rule may be temporarily suspended only by two-thirds
- 22 vote of the members elected to the House by a roll call vote.
- 23 Rule 77 of the Rules of the House of Representatives, insofar as
- 24 it applies to the temporary suspension of the rules of the
- 25 House, shall not apply to this rule.]
