A RESOLUTION

1 Honoring Pennsylvania's senior citizens by recognizing May 2003  
2 as "Older Americans Month" in Pennsylvania.

3 WHEREAS, For more than 30 years, the President of the United  
4 States has designated the month of May as "Older Americans  
5 Month"; and

6 WHEREAS, This year's national theme, "What We Do Makes a  
7 Difference," recognizes the freedom and security we now enjoy  
8 due to the service, hard work and sacrifices of older Americans;  
9 and

1       WHEREAS, Older Americans continue making significant  
2 contributions to our communities, workplaces and homes by giving  
3 freely of themselves and by sharing their wisdom and experience  
4 through civic leadership and mentoring; and

5       WHEREAS, The older Americans of tomorrow will be more  
6 socially, ethnically and economically diverse than any past  
7 generation, which will impact our ideas of work, retirement and  
8 leisure and alter our housing and living arrangements, challenge  
9 our health care systems and reshape our economy; and

10       WHEREAS, The opportunities and challenges that await our  
11 Commonwealth require this Commonwealth to continue to commit to  
12 the goal of ensuring that older Americans enjoy active,  
13 productive and healthy lives with independence, safety and  
14 dignity; and

15       WHEREAS, Pennsylvania proudly ranks second in the nation in  
16 the percentage of population which is 65 years of age and older;

18       WHEREAS, It is appropriate for the Commonwealth to recognize  
19 the month of May as a time to celebrate the contributions of  
20 older Americans and to rededicate our efforts to respect and  
21 better serve older Americans; therefore be it

22       RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives honor  
23 Pennsylvania's senior citizens by recognizing May 2003 as "Older  
24 Americans Month" in Pennsylvania.
