A RESOLUTION

- 1 Designating the week of April 25 through 30, 2004, as "Animal Abuse Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Abuse of animals is a problem in every community of
- 4 this Commonwealth and is not always understood to be the serious
- 5 issue that it is; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Where there is animal cruelty, there is likely to be
- 7 some other form of violence such as spousal abuse, child abuse
- 8 or elder abuse; and
- 9 WHEREAS, People who abuse animals are far more likely to
- 10 abuse other people; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Greater awareness of animal abuse and its causal
- 12 relationship to abuse of humans helps to make neighborhoods
- 13 safer places for animals and people alike; therefore be it
