A RESOLUTION

1 Designating the week of May 16 through 22, 2004, as "Emergency
2 Medical Services Week" in Pennsylvania.

3 WHEREAS, There are more than 47,500 emergency medical
4 technicians (EMT-Bs - Basic and EMT-Ps - Paramedics) and 6,296
5 first responders who deliver 24-hour, seven-days-a-week
6 lifesaving care to persons in need; and

7 WHEREAS, This year's theme, "EMS: There When You Need Us,"
8 focuses on the commitment and dedication of the more than

1 750,000 providers nationwide who render essential community
2 services every day.

3 WHEREAS, "Emergency Medical Services Week" is a time when
4 Emergency Medical Services crews hold activities honoring
5 paramedics, emergency medical technicians, first responders,
6 firefighters and police and provide vital educational material
7 and training to adults and children on a variety of topics,
8 including injury prevention, safety awareness and medical
9 emergencies; and

10 WHEREAS, "Emergency Medical Services Week" is sponsored by
11 the American College of Emergency Physicians and organizational
12 sponsors, including the National Traffic Safety Administration
13 and the Emergency Medical Services for Children program;
14 therefore be it

15 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives honor the
16 Commonwealth's emergency medical service workers by designating
17 the week of May 16 through 22, 2004, as "Emergency Medical
18 Services Week" in Pennsylvania.
