AN ACT

Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for certain 2 3 immunity for hospitals who donate medicine, medical supplies 4 and equipment for humanitarian assistance. 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 6 7 Section 1. Title 42 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a section to read: 8 § 8338.1. Liability for damages from donated medicine, medical 10 supplies and equipment for humanitarian assistance. 11 (a) General rule. -- A hospital is not subject to civil liability arising from the nature or condition of medicine, 12 medical supplies and equipment which were reasonably believed to 13 14 be in good condition and donated in good faith for humanitarian 15 assistance. This section does not apply to an injury or death to any person that results from an act or omission of the donor 16

constituting gross negligence, recklessness or intentional

- 1 (b) Nonliability. -- This section shall not be construed as
- 2 <u>establishing any liability.</u>
- 3 (c) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
- 4 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 5 <u>subsection</u>:
- 6 "Donate." To give or distribute without requiring anything
- 7 of monetary value from the ultimate recipient.
- 8 <u>"Hospital." An entity licensed as a hospital under the act</u>
- 9 of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Public Welfare
- 10 Code, or the act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), known as the
- 11 <u>Health Care Facilities Act.</u>
- 12 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
