## AN ACT

Amending the act of June 24, 1931 (P.L.1206, No.331), entitled 1 2 "An act concerning townships of the first class; amending, 3 revising, consolidating, and changing the law relating thereto," further providing for specific powers. 4 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 6 7 Section 1. Section 1502 of the act of June 24, 1931 8 (P.L.1206, No.331), known as The First Class Township Code, reenacted and amended May 27, 1949 (P.L.1955, No.569), is 9 10 amended by adding a clause to read: 11 Section 1502. The corporate power of a township of the first 12 class shall be vested in the board of township commissioners. 13 The board shall have power--\* \* \* 14 15 LXXVIII. Appropriations to Watershed Associations. To 16 appropriate money to nonprofit watershed associations for

1 watersheds serving the township. ANY MONEYS APPROPRIATED TO A 2 NONPROFIT WATERSHED ASSOCIATION BY THE TOWNSHIP SHALL BE USED 3 ONLY FOR THE FOLLOWING PURPOSES: WETLAND RESTORATION; STREAM 4 BANK STABILIZATION; RIPARIAN BUFFER RESTORATION; WATERWAY 5 CLEANUP INVOLVING REMOVAL OF TRASH OR OTHER MANMADE DEBRIS WITHIN THE WATERWAY; IMPROVEMENTS TO ELIMINATE ACID MINE 6 7 DRAINAGE IMPACTS; AND FOR EXPENSES DIRECTLY RELATED TO 8 ADMINISTRATION AND OPERATION, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, 9 RENT AND OFFICE ITEMS. SUCH APPROPRIATIONS MAY NOT BE USED TO 10 UNDERTAKE LITIGATION AGAINST ANY MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OR TO 11 SEEK REDRESS AGAINST ANY INDIVIDUAL LANDOWNER.
