## AN ACT

11	(a) General ruleThe department shall establish, advertise

15	(b) DefinitionAs used in this section, the term "road
16	rage" means an incident in which an angry or impatient motorist
17	or passenger intentionally injures or kills another motorist,

2 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
