## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, further providing for adoption
- definitions; and establishing the Pennsylvania Adoption
- 4 Information Retrieval System.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Section 2102 of Title 23 of the Pennsylvania
- 8 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a definition to read:
- 9 § 2102. Definitions.
- 10 The following words and phrases when used in this part shall
- 11 have, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, the
- 12 meanings given to them in this section:
- 13 \* \* \*
- 14 "PAIRS." The Pennsylvania Adoption Information Retrieval
- 15 System established in section 2911 (relating to PAIRS).
- 16 \* \* \*
- 17 Section 2. Title 23 is amended by adding a section to read:

- 1 § 2911. PAIRS.
- 2 (a) Establishment. -- In order to develop more reliable data
- 3 on adoption practices and to improve the analysis of trends and
- 4 issues in adoptions, the Department of Public Welfare shall
- 5 <u>establish the Pennsylvania Adoption Information Retrieval System</u>
- 6 to serve as a Statewide data collection and reporting system for
- 7 <u>nonidentifying</u>, <u>statistical information regarding adoptions</u>.
- 8 (b) Data. -- On a quarterly basis, the court, in cooperation
- 9 with the agency or intermediary that facilitated the adoption,
- 10 shall forward to the department the following:
- 11 (1) A form under subsection (d) for each adoption
- finalized by the court during the reporting period.
- 13 (2) The total number of adoptions during the reporting
- 14 <u>period</u>.
- 15 (c) Duty of adoption agency and intermediary.--It is the
- 16 responsibility of the agency or intermediary that facilitated
- 17 the adoption to cooperate to the fullest extent possible in
- 18 providing the court any information concerning the adoption
- 19 which is requested by the department.
- 20 (d) Forms. -- The department shall develop an adoption data
- 21 form and distribute the form to each court of common pleas. The
- 22 form shall require the following nonidentifying information:
- 23 (1) The child's birth date, race and place of birth.
- 24 (2) The birth date and race of the birth parents.
- 25 (3) The birth date and race of the adoptive parents.
- 26 (4) Whether the adoptive parent is a stepparent, foster
- 27 parent or relative of the child and, if the adoptive parent
- is a relative of the child, the relationship.
- 29 <u>(5) Whether parental rights were terminated voluntarily</u>
- or involuntarily, including the date or dates when rights

- 1 were terminated.
- 2 (6) Whether each birth parent consented to the adoption
- 3 and the date the consent was entered.
- 4 (7) Whether and for how long the child was in the
- 5 <u>custody of an agency or in private placement before the</u>
- 6 <u>adoption was finalized.</u>
- 7 (8) The date the court entered the adoption decree.
- 8 (9) Whether the child was eligible for and received
- 9 <u>adoption assistance and what type of assistance, if any.</u>
- 10 (10) Any other information that the department may
- 11 <u>require by regulation.</u>
- 12 (e) Report.--No later than May 1 of each year, the
- 13 department shall submit to the Governor, the Secretary of the
- 14 Senate, the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives and the
- 15 Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts a report on PAIRS
- 16 <u>based upon the statistical information received under subsection</u>
- 17 (b). The department shall include in the report any analyses of
- 18 the data or recommendations which it deems appropriate.
- 19 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 180 days.
