## AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An 2 act relating to the public school system, including certain 3 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 4 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," further providing, in the State System of Higher Education, for powers and duties of the 6 Board of Governors. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 8 hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. Section 2006-A(a)(11) of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, 11 12 added November 12, 1982 (P.L.660, No.188), is amended to read: 13 Section 2006-A. Powers and Duties of the Board of Governors.--(a) The Board of Governors shall have overall 14 responsibility for planning and coordinating the development and 15 operation of the system. The powers and duties of the Board of 16 17 Governors shall be: 18 To fix the levels of tuition fees, except student 19

- 11 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
