AN ACT

- Amending the act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.216, No.76), entitled "An act relating to dentistry; defining and providing for the licensing and registration of dentists and dental hygienists, 3 and for the revocation and suspension of such licenses and 4 registrations, subject to appeal, and for their 6 reinstatement; defining the powers and duties of the State 7 Dental Council and Examining Board and the Department of 8 Public Instruction; providing penalties; and repealing 9 existing laws, " further providing for the definitions of "dental hygienist" and "board"; providing for the definition of "independent dental hygiene practitioner"; further 10 11 12 providing for the general powers of the State Board of 13 Dentistry and for radiologic procedures, education and 14 training; and providing for the independent practice of 15 dental hygienists.
- 16 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 17 hereby enacts as follows:
- 18 Section 1. The definitions of "dental hygienist" and "board"
- 19 in section 2 of the act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.216, No.76), known
- 20 as The Dental Law, amended February 9, 1984 (P.L.23, No.9), are

- 1 amended and the section is amended by adding a definition to
- 2 read:
- 3 Section 2. Definitions.--* * *
- 4 A "Dental Hygienist" is one who is legally licensed as such
- 5 by the [said dental council and examining board] State Board of
- 6 <u>Dentistry</u> to perform those educational, preventive, and
- 7 therapeutic services and procedures that licensed dental
- 8 hygienists are educated to perform. Licensed dentists may assign
- 9 to [their employed] dental hygienists intra-oral procedures
- 10 which the hygienists have been educated to perform and which
- 11 require their professional competence and skill but which do not
- 12 require the professional competence and skill of the [employer-
- 13 dentist] dentist. Such assignments shall be under the
- 14 supervision of a licensed dentist. Such performance of intra-
- 15 oral procedures by licensed dental hygienists shall be in the
- 16 <u>private</u> office of a dentist or public or private institution
- 17 such as schools, hospitals, orphanages, and sanitoria or State
- 18 health cars. <u>Dental hygienists certified as independent dental</u>
- 19 hygiene practitioners may perform intra-oral procedures without
- 20 the assignment of a dentist pursuant to section 11.9. The
- 21 foregoing shall not be construed as authorizing the assignment
- 22 of diagnosing, treatment planning and writing prescriptions for
- 23 drugs or writing authorizations for restorative, prosthetic, or
- 24 orthodontic appliances. The board shall issue rules setting
- 25 forth the necessary education and defining the procedures that
- 26 may be performed by dental hygienists licensed under this act
- 27 including those procedures that may be performed under direct
- 28 and general supervision.
- The word "board," as used in this act, means the [State
- 30 Dental Council and Examining Board] State Board of Dentistry.

- 2 <u>"Independent Dental Hygiene Practitioner" means a licensed</u>
- 3 <u>dental hygienist who may perform educational, preventative,</u>
- 4 therapeutic and intra-oral procedures which the hygienist is
- 5 educated to perform and which requires the hygienist's
- 6 professional competence and skill but which do not require the
- 7 professional competence and skill of a dentist without the
- 8 <u>authorization</u>, <u>assignment or examination of a dentist</u>, <u>and who</u>
- 9 <u>is certified by the State Board of Dentistry as having satisfied</u>
- 10 the requirements of section 11.9. Independent dental hygiene
- 11 practitioners may only engage in professional practice in the
- 12 practice sites enumerated in section 11.9(b).
- 13 Section 2. Section 3(d) of the act, amended December 27,
- 14 1994 (P.L.1361, No.160), is amended to read:
- 15 Section 3. General Powers of the State Board of Dentistry.--
- 16 The State Board of Dentistry (hereinafter called the board)
- 17 shall have the following powers and duties:
- 18 * * *
- 19 (d) To provide for and to regulate the licensing, and to
- 20 license as a dental hygienist, after examination, any duly
- 21 qualified person, not less than eighteen years of age, of good
- 22 moral character, not addicted to the use of intoxicating liquor
- 23 or narcotic drugs, who has obtained the required education[,
- 24 together with a certificate or diploma from an approved
- 25 institution or college] for the training of dental hygienists[.]
- 26 from an approved institution or college that meets or exceeds
- 27 the minimum standards established by an approved United States
- 28 Department of Education-recognized regional accrediting agency
- 29 <u>or the American Dental Association Commission on Dental</u>
- 30 Accreditation. The board shall, consistent with this act, adopt

- 1 regulations providing for the general supervision and practice
- 2 of dental hygienists under this act.

- 4 Section 3. Section 11.4(a) of the act, added December 20,
- 5 1985 (P.L.513, No.118), is amended and the section is amended by
- 6 adding subsections to read:
- 7 Section 11.4. Radiologic Procedures; Education and Training
- 8 Required.--(a) On and after January 1, 1987, no auxiliary
- 9 personnel <u>except dental hygienists and independent dental</u>
- 10 <u>hygiene practitioners</u> shall perform radiologic procedures on the
- 11 premises of the dentist unless such person is under the direct
- 12 supervision of a dentist who is on the premises at the time the
- 13 X-ray is taken and unless such person has passed an examination
- 14 approved by the board and administered in accordance with
- 15 section 812.1 of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175)
- 16 known as "The Administrative Code of 1929."
- 17 * * *
- (e) Notwithstanding the supervision requirements of this
- 19 act, an independent dental hygiene practitioner may perform
- 20 radiological procedures in any setting without supervision of a
- 21 <u>dentist on or after the effective date of this subsection.</u>
- 22 (f) A dental hygienist may perform radiologic procedures in
- 23 any setting under the general supervision of a licensed dentist.
- 24 For the purposes of this subsection, "general supervision" means
- 25 <u>supervision</u> by a dentist who examines the patient, develops a
- 26 <u>dental treatment plan, authorizes the performance of the</u>
- 27 radiologic services to be performed within one year of the
- 28 <u>examination</u>, and takes full professional responsibility for
- 29 performance of the dental hygienist.
- 30 Section 4. The act is amended by adding a section to read:

- 1 <u>Section 11.9. Independent Dental Hygiene Practitioner.--(a)</u>
- 2 <u>Independent dental hygiene practitioners must satisfy and shall</u>
- 3 <u>be certified by the board upon meeting the following criteria:</u>
- 4 (1) Completion of one thousand eight hundred hours of
- 5 practice under the supervision of a licensed dentist.
- 6 (2) Purchase of a malpractice policy in an amount determined
- 7 to be adequate by the board.
- 8 (b) The professional practice of an independent dental
- 9 <u>hygiene practitioner shall be limited to the following practice</u>
- 10 sites:
- 11 <u>(1) Schools.</u>
- 12 (2) Correctional facilities.
- 13 (3) "Health care facility" as defined in section 802.1 of
- 14 the act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), known as the "Health
- 15 Care Facilities Act."
- 16 (4) "Personal care home" as defined in section 1001 of the
- 17 act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the "Public
- 18 Welfare Code."
- 19 (5) "Domiciliary care" as defined in section 2202-A of the
- 20 <u>act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as "The</u>
- 21 Administrative Code of 1929."
- 22 (6) An "older adult daily living center" as defined in
- 23 section 2 of the act of July 11, 1990 (P.L.499, No.118), known
- 24 as the "Older Adult Daily Living Centers Licensing Act."
- 25 (7) A "facility" as defined in section 3 of the act of June
- 26 18, 1984 (P.L.391, No.82), known as the "Continuing-Care
- 27 Provider Registration and Disclosure Act."
- 28 (8) A public or private institution under the jurisdiction
- 29 of a Federal, State or local agency.
- 30 (9) Other institutions the board deems appropriate.

1 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
