AN ACT

- 1 Providing for a Senior Citizen Volunteer Incentive Program to
- 2 provide property tax credits to senior citizens who volunteer
- 3 in their local school districts.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Short title.
- 7 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Senior
- 8 Citizen Real Property Tax Incentive for Volunteering Act.
- 9 Section 2. Legislative intent.
- 10 The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:
- 11 (1) It is the intent of the General Assembly to
- 12 establish a program that provides benefits to senior
- 13 citizens, school-aged children and school districts.
- 14 (2) This legislation authorizes school districts to

- 1 participate in a program to provide property tax relief to
- 2 senior citizens while helping schools meet an increasing
- 3 demand for a variety of human skills and services.
- 4 (3) Both senior citizens and children benefit from
- 5 establishing a relationship in which they interact with one
- another in a positive learning environment.
- 7 Section 3. Definitions.
- 8 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 9 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 10 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 11 "Department." The Department of Aging of the Commonwealth.
- 12 "Eligible participant." A person 65 years of age or older
- 13 and who has been a resident of this Commonwealth for at least
- 14 one year and is an owner of real property in this Commonwealth.
- 15 "Foundation." A program or institution established to
- 16 provide funds in the form of grants or that establishes a
- 17 partnership that provides incentives for involved parties.
- 18 "Homestead." A dwelling, whether owned or rented, and as
- 19 much of the land surrounding it as is reasonably necessary for
- 20 use of the dwelling as a home and occupied by a claimant. A
- 21 homestead shall also include premises occupied by reason of
- 22 ownership or lease in a cooperative housing corporation, mobile
- 23 homes which are assessed as realty for local property tax
- 24 purposes and the land, if owned or rented by the claimant, upon
- 25 which the mobile home is situated, and other similar living
- 26 accommodations, as well as a part of a multidwelling or
- 27 multipurpose building and a part of the land upon which it is
- 28 built. The term also includes:
- 29 (1) Premises occupied by reason of the claimant's
- 30 ownership or rental of a dwelling located on land owned by a

- 1 nonprofit incorporated association, of which the claimant is
- a member if the claimant is required to pay a pro rata share
- of the property taxes levied against the association's land.
- 4 (2) Premises occupied by a claimant if the claimant is
- 5 required by law to pay a property tax by reason of the
- 6 claimant's ownership or rental, including a possessory
- 7 interest in the dwelling, the land or both.
- 8 "Owner." Includes a person in possession under a contract of
- 9 sale, deed of trust, life estate, joint tenancy or tenancy in
- 10 common or by reason of statutes of descent and distribution.
- 11 "Participating school district." A school district within
- 12 this Commonwealth that has taken action, as set forth in section
- 13 5, to provide property tax credits as established under this
- 14 act.
- 15 "Program." The Senior Citizen Volunteer Incentive Program
- 16 established under section 4.
- 17 "Real property taxes." All taxes on a homestead levied by a
- 18 school district, due and payable during a calendar year.
- 19 Section 4. Establishment.
- 20 There is hereby established a Senior Citizen Volunteer
- 21 Incentive Program which authorizes participating school
- 22 districts to accept senior citizens who reside in a
- 23 participating school district as volunteers in any school within
- 24 the participating school district. The senior citizens shall
- 25 receive a real property tax credit in exchange for their
- 26 services.
- 27 Section 5. Local guidelines.
- 28 (a) School district participation. -- A school district shall
- 29 by resolution or ordinance indicate participation in the program
- 30 set forth in this act. Upon passage of the resolution or

- 1 ordinance, the participating school district shall be subject to
- 2 the guidelines and regulations set forth in this act.
- 3 (b) School district guidelines.--Participating school
- 4 districts shall promulgate specific guidelines regarding the
- 5 program, including the acceptance of eligible participants. The
- 6 guidelines shall include, but not be limited to, a criminal
- 7 background check for eligible participants.
- 8 (c) Tax credit.--The rate of real property tax credit for
- 9 eligible participants shall be determined by the participating
- 10 school district. The rate of the credit shall be uniform for all
- 11 eligible participants within any one participating school
- 12 district. The rate of the credit may be set at a uniform level
- 13 established by the school district and shall not be less than \$5
- 14 an hour. The tax credits granted through this program may not
- 15 exceed the total amount of real property taxes that are owed.
- 16 (d) Services. -- The types of services that seniors may
- 17 provide must enhance the academic program of a school district.
- 18 (e) Annual report.--The department shall coordinate an
- 19 annual report that all participating school districts must
- 20 provide to the department by March 1. The report shall include,
- 21 at a minimum, the following:
- 22 (1) Name of the person supervising the program within
- 23 the school district.
- 24 (2) Scope of the program and funding sources.
- 25 (3) District guidelines regarding acceptance of eligible
- 26 participants.
- 27 (4) Services that the eligible participants are
- assisting with or providing.
- 29 (5) Fiscal impact of the program on the school district.
- 30 (6) Overall impact of the program on the school

- district.
- 2 Section 6. Income exemption.
- 3 The real property tax credit granted under this act shall not
- 4 be subject to the tax imposed under Article III of the act of
- 5 March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of
- 6 1971, nor shall it be subject to the tax imposed under section
- 7 13 of the act of December 31, 1965 (P.L.1257, No.511), known as
- 8 The Local Tax Enabling Act.
- 9 Section 7. Workers' compensation exemption.
- 10 An eligible participant who is participating in the program
- 11 established under this act shall not be considered an employee
- 12 for any purpose, including, but not limited to, liability,
- 13 unemployment compensation, workers' compensation or other
- 14 employee benefit provided by the school district.
- 15 Section 8. Powers and duties of department.
- 16 (a) Cooperation. -- The department in cooperation with the
- 17 Department of Education and the Department of Revenue shall
- 18 promulgate guidelines and regulations for the implementation of
- 19 the program established under this act.
- 20 (b) Project description and publication. -- The department
- 21 shall provide each school district with a description of the
- 22 program and shall publicize the program to senior citizens.
- 23 (c) Annual report. -- The department shall report to the
- 24 General Assembly annually by April 1 on the overall impact and
- 25 effectiveness of the program.
- 26 Section 9. Job preservation.
- 27 The program may not replace or supplant existing job
- 28 positions within the school district.
- 29 Section 10. Funding.
- Funding for the program shall be arranged by the respective

- 1 school districts. A school district may seek funding through
- 2 private and public foundations.
- 3 Section 11. Effective date.
- This act shall take effect immediately. 4
