AN ACT

- 1 Establishing the Child Psychiatrist Loan Forgiveness Program in
- the Department of Health; and providing for powers and duties
- 3 of the Department of Health.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Short title.
- 7 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Child
- 8 Psychiatrist Loan Forgiveness Act.
- 9 Section 2. Purpose.
- 10 The purpose of this act is to provide an incentive to medical
- 11 students to pursue training in child psychiatry, which is
- 12 essential to the delivery of quality health care services to
- 13 children and their families in this Commonwealth.
- 14 Section 3. Definitions.
- 15 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 16 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 17 context clearly indicates otherwise:

- 1 "Child psychiatrist." A physician who specializes in the
- 2 prevention, diagnosis and treatment of mental illness with
- 3 additional training in child psychiatry.
- 4 "Department." The Department of Health of the Commonwealth.
- 5 "Health care facility." As defined in the act of July 19,
- 6 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), known as the Health Care Facilities Act.
- 7 "Program." The Child Psychiatrist Loan Forgiveness Program
- 8 established by this act.
- 9 Section 4. Program.
- 10 (a) Establishment. -- The Child Psychiatrist Loan Forgiveness
- 11 Program is established in the department.
- 12 (b) Applications.--The department shall promulgate
- 13 guidelines for the selection of candidates to the program based
- 14 upon the following criteria:
- 15 (1) Demonstrated need.
- 16 (2) Willingness to continue practicing as a child
- 17 psychiatrist in this Commonwealth after completing the
- 18 program.
- 19 (c) Eligibility. -- A program applicant must be:
- 20 (1) A citizen of the United States.
- 21 (2) Licensed to practice medicine in this Commonwealth.
- 22 (d) Selection.--The department shall give preference to
- 23 physicians in the following order:
- 24 (1) Commonwealth physicians completing training in child
- 25 psychiatry in this Commonwealth.
- 26 (2) Out-of-State applicants completing training in child
- 27 psychiatry in this Commonwealth.
- 28 (3) Commonwealth natives completing out-of-State
- 29 training in child psychiatry.
- 30 (4) Out-of-State candidates completing out-of-State

- 1 training in child psychiatry.
- 2 (e) Verification. -- The department shall monitor and verify a
- 3 physician's fulfillment of all requirements under this act.
- 4 Section 5. Amount of loan forgiveness.
- 5 A physician accepted into the program may be reimbursed an
- 6 amount up to \$50,000 per year for each year of specialty
- 7 training in child psychiatry based upon the following repayment
- 8 assistance schedule:
- 9 (1) First year of service, 20%.
- 10 (2) Second year of service, 20%.
- 11 (3) Third year of service, 20%.
- 12 (4) Fourth year of service, 20%.
- 13 (5) Fifth year of service, 20%.
- 14 Section 6. Contract.
- 15 (a) General rule.--Physicians receiving loan forgiveness
- 16 shall enter into a contract with the department. The contract
- 17 shall include, but not be limited to, the following terms and
- 18 conditions:
- 19 (1) The physician shall agree to practice not fewer than
- 20 five full consecutive years in a licensed health care
- 21 facility in this Commonwealth immediately following
- 22 completion of specialty training pursuant to the schedule
- 23 provided in section 5.
- 24 (2) The physician shall agree to practice on a full-time
- 25 basis.
- 26 (3) The physician shall agree to accept Medicare and
- 27 Medicaid patients.
- 28 (4) The physician shall agree not to discriminate
- against patients based on the ability to pay.
- 30 (5) The physician shall permit the department to monitor

- 1 compliance with the work requirement.
- 2 (6) The department shall certify compliance with the
- 3 terms of the contract for purposes of receipt by the
- 4 physician of loan forgiveness awards for years subsequent to
- 5 the initial year of the loan.
- 6 (7) The contract shall be renewable on an annual basis
- 7 upon certification by the department that the physician has
- 8 complied with the terms of the contract.
- 9 (8) The contract shall terminate if the physician dies,
- is not able to perform the duties of a child psychiatrist or
- is not able to maintain the physician's license to practice
- medicine due to physical or mental disability.
- 13 (9) If the physician's license to practice is suspended
- or revoked, the department shall have the authority to
- terminate the physician's participation in the program and
- demand repayment of all loan forgiveness payments rendered to
- 17 date.
- 18 (10) A physician who fails to begin or complete the
- 19 obligations contracted for shall reimburse the Commonwealth
- 20 all amounts received under this act and interest thereon as
- 21 determined by the department. Both the physician and the
- 22 department shall make every effort to resolve conflicts in
- order to prevent a breach of contract.
- 24 (b) Contract enforcement. -- The department shall have the
- 25 authority to seek garnishment of wages for the collection of
- 26 damages provided for in subsection (a)(10).
- 27 Section 7. Disqualification.
- 28 Any person who knowingly or intentionally procures, obtains
- 29 or aids another to procure or obtain loan forgiveness under this
- 30 act through fraudulent means shall be disqualified from

- 1 participation and shall be liable to the department for an
- 2 amount equal to three times the amount obtained.
- 3 Section 8. Tax consequences.
- 4 Loan forgiveness payments received by a physician shall not
- 5 be considered taxable income for purposes of Article III of the
- 6 act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code
- 7 of 1971.
- 8 Section 9. Limitation.
- 9 Participation in the program is limited to no more than four
- 10 physicians a year unless sufficient funding is available to
- 11 reimburse more than four physicians a year in accordance with
- 12 this act.
- 13 Section 10. Regulations.
- 14 The department may adopt regulations and procedures necessary
- 15 to carry out the purposes of this act.
- 16 Section 11. Funding.
- 17 Loan forgiveness repayments shall be made to the extent that
- 18 funds are appropriated to the Child Psychiatrist Loan
- 19 Forgiveness Program by the General Assembly.
- 20 Section 12. Effective date.
- 21 This act shall take effect in 90 days.
