A RESOLUTION

1 Designating the week of May 15 through 21, 2005, as "Emergency
2 Medical Services Week" in Pennsylvania.

3 WHEREAS, There are more than 40,000 emergency medical
4 technicians (EMT-Bs - Basic and EMT-Ps - Paramedics) and 5,300
5 first responders who deliver 24-hour, seven-days-a-week
6 lifesaving care to persons in need; and

7 WHEREAS, The American College of Emergency Physicians and
8 other organizations, including the National Traffic Safety

1 Administration and the Emergency Medical Services for Children
2 program sponsor "Emergency Medical Services Week"; and

3 WHEREAS, "Emergency Medical Services Week" is a time when
4 Emergency Medical Services crews hold activities honoring
5 paramedics, emergency medical technicians, first responders,
6 firefighters and police and provide vital educational material
7 and training to adults and children on a variety of topics,
8 including injury prevention, safety awareness and medical
9 emergencies; and

10 WHEREAS, This year's theme, "EMS: Ready, Responsive,
11 Reliable," focuses on the commitment and dedication of the more
12 than 750,000 providers nationwide who render essential community
13 services every day; therefore be it

14 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives honor the
15 Commonwealth's emergency medical service workers by designating
16 the week of May 15 through 21, 2005, as "Emergency Medical
17 Services Week" in Pennsylvania.
