A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the 25th anniversary of the Pennsylvania Fish and
- 2 Boat Commission's founding of the Pennsylvania League of
- 3 Angling Youth (PLAY) and honoring PLAY's contributions to
- 4 this Commonwealth.
- 5 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission
- 6 administers PLAY for children ages eight to 12 to provide free
- 7 aquatic education and stimulate interest in fishing and boating;
- 8 and
- 9 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Fish Commission officially titled
- 10 PLAY in 1980; and
- 11 WHEREAS, PLAY originated with aquatic education programs
- 12 begun in the 1960s as a way to introduce urban youth to fishing;
- 13 and

- 1 WHEREAS, As of March 2005, there are 44,500 members
- 2 Statewide, including 4,500 individual memberships and 40,000
- 3 members who participate through schools; and
- 4 WHEREAS, PLAY currently utilizes 14 salaried employees and
- 5 hundreds of volunteers who offer free educational materials,
- 6 classroom presentations and quarterly newsletters to each
- 7 member; and
- 8 WHEREAS, PLAY distributes an additional 35,000 publications
- 9 yearly at public events and trade shows; and
- 10 WHEREAS, PLAY provides instruction on boating and fishing
- 11 safety; and
- 12 WHEREAS, PLAY broadens youth awareness of ethical and
- 13 environmental concerns such as littering and overfishing; and
- 14 WHEREAS, PLAY assists our communities in providing mentors
- 15 for children so that they may pursue interests in aquatic
- 16 hobbies and sports; therefore be it
- 17 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 18 25th anniversary of the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission's
- 19 founding of the Pennsylvania League of Angling Youth (PLAY) and
- 20 honor PLAY for making aquatic education available to children in
- 21 this Commonwealth.
