5	WHEREAS, Our nation will celebrate the 400th anniversary of
б	the founding of Jamestown in 2007; and
7	WHEREAS, Captain John Smith's leadership and courage were
8	instrumental in establishing the colony; and
9	WHEREAS, Captain John Smith and his 12-man crew explored
10	almost 3,000 miles of the Chesapeake Bay and its tributaries;
11	and
12	WHEREAS, Captain John Smith's vivid descriptions of the
13	Chesapeake Bay and its tributaries inspired exploration and
14	settlement of the New World; and
15	WHEREAS, Legislation has been introduced in the United States
16	Senate to direct the United States Secretary of the Interior to
17	study the feasibility of designating the Captain John Smith
18	Chesapeake National Historic Watertrail as a national historic

WHEREAS, Designation of the Captain John Smith Chesapeake 2 3 National Historic Watertrail as a national historic trail would provide rich opportunities for education, recreation and 4 heritage tourism for the 16 million Americans living in the 5 6 Chesapeake Bay watershed and for visitors to the region; and 7 WHEREAS, Designation of the Captain John Smith Chesapeake National Historic Watertrail as a national historic trail would 8 9 complement the more than 645 miles of existing water trails in the Susquehanna River Basin of this Commonwealth; and 10 WHEREAS, The Susquehanna River supplies more than 50% of the 11 12 fresh water of the Chesapeake Bay; therefore be it 13 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania support efforts to direct the 14 15 United States Secretary of the Interior to study the feasibility of designating the Captain John Smith Chesapeake National 16 Historic Watertrail as a national historic trail. 17
