A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the month of May 2006 as "Healthy Babies Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, The March of Dimes is declaring May 2006 as "Healthy
- 4 Babies Month" in order to educate men and women of childbearing
- 5 age about the importance of preconception and prenatal care,
- 6 nutrition and a healthy lifestyle in order to enhance positive
- 7 birth outcomes; and
- 8 WHEREAS, According to the most recently released data of the
- 9 National Center for Health Statistics, in 2003, 16,770 babies

- 1 were born prematurely in this Commonwealth, accounting for more
- 2 than 11% of live births; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The rate of premature births in this Commonwealth
- 4 has increased nearly 9% in the last decade, from 10.6% in 1993
- 5 to 11.6% in 2003; and
- 6 WHEREAS, In this Commonwealth premature birth with
- 7 accompanying low birth weight is the second leading cause of
- 8 infant death (death in the first year of life) and the leading
- 9 cause of newborn death (death in the first month of life); and
- 10 WHEREAS, Prematurity is the number one obstetric problem in
- 11 our nation, with one out of every eight babies, including one
- 12 out of every six African-American babies, born prematurely; and
- WHEREAS, Prematurity is a major medical challenge in
- 14 obstetrics and pediatrics and a significant determinant of
- 15 morbidity and morality in infancy and throughout the lifetime of
- 16 babies born prematurely; and
- 17 WHEREAS, A recent national survey conducted by the March of
- 18 Dimes found that only 35% of respondents identified prematurity
- 19 as "very serious" or "extremely serious"; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Pregnant women can benefit from new knowledge,
- 21 skills and technology and seek diagnosis and treatment for high-
- 22 risk medical conditions; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Early, regular preconception and prenatal care is a
- 24 pregnant woman's first line of defense for protecting her baby;
- 25 and
- 26 WHEREAS, Recommendations for a healthy pregnancy include
- 27 prevention of infections such as rubella, not using prescription
- 28 or over-the-counter medications without approval of a doctor and
- 29 avoiding tobacco, alcohol and illicit substances; therefore be
- 30 it

- 1 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 2 month of May 2006 as "Healthy Babies Month" in Pennsylvania and
- 3 urge parents and prospective parents to contact the March of
- 4 Dimes and allied health care organizations for literature on how
- 5 to prepare themselves before conception and during pregnancy.
