1 6702. Definitions.

2 § 6701. Scope.

3 This chapter establishes a Statewide program to be known as
4 the Helping Our Pupils to Excellence (HOPE) in Pennsylvania
5 Scholarship Program.

6 § 6702. Definitions.

7 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
8 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
9 context clearly indicates otherwise:

10 "Academic year." A period of time, typically nine months, in 11 which a full-time student is expected to complete the equivalent 12 of at least two semesters' or three quarters' academic work.

13 "Agency." The Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance14 Agency.

15 "Certificate." A credential, other than a degree, indicating 16 satisfactory completion of training in a program of study 17 offered by an eligible public institution of higher education. 18 "Diploma." A credential, other than a degree, indicating 19 satisfactory completion of training in a program of study 20 offered by an eligible public institution of higher education. 21 "Drop and add period." The period of time, early in a 22 quarter or semester, when a freshman student, sophomore student, junior student or senior student may change course load, by 23 24 changing, adding or removing courses.

25 "Eligible institution of higher education." A school which 26 is:

(1) A unit of the State System of Higher Education.
(2) A community college established under Article XIX-A
of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the
Public School Code of 1949.

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(3) A private institution of higher education.

2 "Eligible public institution of higher education." A State-3 owned institution or a State-related institution.

4 "Eligible student." A person who:

5 (1) Is a freshman student, sophomore student, junior
6 student or senior student.

7 (2) Meets the requirements of section 6712 (relating to
8 eligibility requirements at public institutions of higher
9 education) or 6713 (relating to eligibility requirements at
10 private institutions of higher education).

11

(3) Is eligible for a HOPE in Pennsylvania Scholarship.

12 (4) Is not rendered otherwise ineligible for a HOPE in13 Pennsylvania Scholarship under section 6713.

14 "Freshman student." A student at an institution of higher 15 education who has attempted less than 46 quarter hours or less 16 than 30 semester hours.

17 "Full-time student." A matriculated student attending an 18 institution of higher education and enrolled for the equivalent 19 of at least 12 quarter or semester hours.

20 "Fund." The HOPE in Pennsylvania Scholarship Fund21 established in this chapter.

22 "Grade point average." The numbered grade average calculated 23 using a 4.0 scale.

24 "HOPE in Pennsylvania Scholarship." A Helping Our Pupils to 25 Excellence in Pennsylvania Scholarship for education awarded in 26 accordance with this chapter.

27 "Junior student." A student at an institution of higher 28 education who has attempted at least 91 quarter hours but less 29 than 136 quarter hours or at least 61 semester hours but less 30 than 91 semester hours.

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"Mandatory fees." Either of the following:

2 (1) The fees approved by the State System of Higher
3 Education and imposed by eligible public institutions of
4 higher education.

5 (2) The fees imposed by private institutions of higher6 education.

7 "Matriculated status." Being recognized as a student in a
8 defined program of study leading to a degree, diploma or
9 certificate at an institution of higher education.

10 "Private institution of higher education." An institution of 11 higher education which is located in this Commonwealth that 12 provides an organized four-year program of undergraduate 13 instruction toward a baccalaureate degree and that is not a 14 public institution of higher education.

15 "Program" or "HOPE in Pennsylvania Scholarship Program." The 16 Helping Our Pupils to Excellence in Pennsylvania Scholarship 17 Program established in this chapter.

18 "Quarter hours." This term includes each quarter hour 19 attempted, whether remedial or for credit toward a degree, but 20 shall not include any quarter hour attempted or completed before 21 graduating from high school or earning a general educational 22 development equivalency diploma.

23 "Semester hours." This term includes each semester hour 24 attempted, whether remedial or for credit toward a degree, but 25 shall not include any semester hour attempted before graduating 26 high school or earning a general educational development 27 equivalency diploma.

28 "Senior student." A student at an institution of higher
29 education who has attempted at least 136 quarter hours but less
30 than 191 quarter hours or at least 91 semester hours but less
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1 than 128 semester hours.

"Sophomore student." A student at an institution of higher 2 3 education who has attempted at least 46 quarter hours but less 4 than 91 quarter hours or at least 31 semester hours but less 5 than 61 semester hours. 6 "State-owned institution." An institution which is part of 7 the State System of Higher Education pursuant to Article XX-A of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public 8 School Code of 1949. 9 "State-related institution." The Pennsylvania State 10 11 University, the University of Pittsburgh, Temple University and Lincoln University and their branch campuses. 12 13 "Title IV." Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (Public Law 89-329, 79 Stat. 1219). 14 15 SUBCHAPTER B 16 ADMINISTRATION OF PROGRAM 17 Sec. 18 6711. Establishment. 6712. Establishment. 27 (a) General rule.--The Helping Our Pupils to Excellence in 28 Pennsylvania Scholarship Program is established and may be 29 referred to as the HOPE in Pennsylvania Scholarship Program. The 30 program shall be administered by the Pennsylvania Higher

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1 Education Assistance Agency.

2 (b) Agency duties.--The agency shall:

3 (1) Prepare and supervise the issuance of public4 information concerning the provisions of the program.

5 (2) Prescribe the form and regulate the submission of
6 applications for HOPE in Pennsylvania Scholarships.

7 (3) Conduct any conferences and interviews with
8 applicants that may be appropriate.

9 (4) Administer or contract for the administration of 10 appropriate examinations.

11

1 (5) Determine the eligibility of applicants.

12

(6) Select qualified recipients.

13 (7) Award the appropriate HOPE in Pennsylvania14 Scholarships.

15 (8) Make all necessary and proper rules, consistent with 16 this chapter, for the efficient exercise of the duties set 17 forth in this chapter.

18 (9) Promulgate rules and regulations that may restrict 19 eligibility for HOPE in Pennsylvania Scholarships or reduce 20 the dollar amount of HOPE in Pennsylvania Scholarships and 21 grants.

22 § 6712. Eligibility requirements at public institutions of23 higher education.

(a) Freshman students.--To be eligible for a HOPE in
Pennsylvania Scholarship, a freshman student entering and
seeking an associate or baccalaureate degree at an eligible
public institution of higher education shall:

(1) Meet residency requirements by satisfying the
qualifications for higher education grant domicile as
promulgated by the agency.

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(2) Meet achievement standards by:

2 (i) having graduated from a high school with an
3 average cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0;
4 or

5 (ii) in the case of a student who is otherwise6 qualified but:

7 (A) did not graduate from high school or
8 complete a home study program and having received a
9 general educational development equivalency diploma;
10 or

11 (B) completed a home study program meeting the requirements of section 1327.1 of the act of March 12 13 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in lieu of graduating from an eligible 14 15 high school, earning a cumulative grade point average 16 of at least 3.0 at an eligible institution of higher 17 education at the end of the quarter or semester in 18 which the student has attempted 45 quarter hours or 19 30 semester hours.

20 (3) Meet enrollment standards by being admitted,
21 enrolled and classified as an undergraduate student in a
22 matriculated status.

23 The HOPE in Pennsylvania Scholarship for the freshman student's 24 year shall be paid at the end of the freshman year.

(b) Sophomore students.--To be eligible for a HOPE in Pennsylvania Scholarship, a sophomore student seeking an associate or baccalaureate degree at an eligible public institution of higher education shall:

29 (1) Meet residency requirements by satisfying the 30 qualifications for higher education grant domicile as 20050S0026B0018 - 7 -

promulgated by the agency.

2 (2) Meet achievement standards by meeting the following3 criteria:

4 (i) Earn a cumulative grade point average of at
5 least 3.0 at an eligible public institution of higher
6 education at the end of the quarter or semester in which
7 the student has attempted 45 quarter hours or 30 semester
8 hours.

9 (ii) Maintain satisfactory academic progress in a 10 course of study in accordance with the standards and 11 practices used for Federal Title IV programs by the 12 institution of higher education in which the student is 13 enrolled.

14 (3) Meet enrollment standards by being admitted,
15 enrolled and classified as an undergraduate student in a
16 matriculated status.

17 (c) Junior students.--To be eligible for a HOPE in
18 Pennsylvania Scholarship, a junior student seeking a
19 baccalaureate degree at a public institution of higher education
20 shall:

(1) Meet residency requirements by meeting the
qualifications for higher education grant domicile as
promulgated by the agency.

24 (2) Meet achievement standards by meeting the following25 criteria:

26 (i) Earn a cumulative grade point average of at
27 least 3.0 at an eligible public institution of higher
28 education at the end of the quarter or semester in which
29 the student has attempted 90 quarter hours or 60 semester
30 hours.

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1 (ii) Maintain satisfactory academic progress in a 2 course of study in accordance with the standards and 3 practices used for Federal Title IV programs by the 4 institution of higher education in which the student is 5 enrolled.

6 (3) Meet enrollment standards by being admitted,
7 enrolled and classified as an undergraduate student in a
8 matriculated status.

9 (d) Senior students.--To be eligible for a HOPE in
10 Pennsylvania Scholarship, a senior student seeking a
11 baccalaureate degree at a public institution of higher education
12 shall:

13 (1) Meet residency requirements by satisfying the
14 qualifications for higher education grant domicile as
15 promulgated by the agency.

16 (2) Meet achievement standards by meeting the following 17 criteria:

18 (i) Earn a cumulative grade point average of at
19 least 3.0 at an eligible public institution of higher
20 education at the end of the quarter or semester in which
21 the student has attempted 135 quarter hours or 90
22 semester hours.

(ii) Maintain satisfactory academic progress in a
course of study in accordance with the standards and
practices used for Federal Title IV programs by the
institution of higher education in which the student is
enrolled.

(3) Meet enrollment standards by being admitted,
enrolled and classified as an undergraduate student in a
matriculated status.

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1 (e) Requalification.--A student who fails to maintain a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 at the end of the 2 3 quarter or semester in which the student has attempted 45 4 quarter hours or 30 semester hours may attend the next 45 quarter or 30 semester hours without a HOPE in Pennsylvania 5 Scholarship. An otherwise eligible student who regains a 6 cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 at the end of a 7 8 quarter or semester in which the student has attempted 90 quarter hours or 60 semester hours may requalify for a HOPE in 9 10 Pennsylvania Scholarship.

(f) No minimum hours required.--For students eligible for a HOPE in Pennsylvania Scholarship under this section, no minimum number of hours of enrollment may be required by the agency.

14 (g) Termination of eligibility.--

15 (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2), a student may 16 receive a HOPE in Pennsylvania Scholarship until the first of 17 these events:

18 (i) the student has earned a baccalaureate degree;19 or

20 (ii) the student has attempted at any institution of
21 higher education a total of 190 quarter hours or 127
22 semester hours.

(2) A student enrolled in an undergraduate degree
program designed to be more than 190 quarter hours or 127
semester hours in length is eligible to receive a HOPE in
Pennsylvania Scholarship for the lesser of:

27 (i) a total of 225 attempted quarter hours or 150
28 attempted semester hours; or

29 (ii) the number of hours required for graduation if 30 the student has a cumulative grade point average of at 20050S0026B0018 - 10 -

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least 3.0 after the term in which the student attempted 190 quarter hours or 127 semester hours.

3 (h) Amount of HOPE in Pennsylvania Scholarship. -- Subject to 4 the amounts contained in the HOPE in Pennsylvania Scholarship 5 Fund, a HOPE in Pennsylvania Scholarship awarded under this chapter shall include tuition, approved mandatory fees and a 6 book allowance not to exceed \$100 per guarter or \$150 per 7 semester. In the event the amount of funding in the HOPE in 8 Pennsylvania Scholarship Fund is insufficient to fund all HOPE 9 10 in Pennsylvania Scholarships for students attending public 11 institutions of higher education, the amount of the HOPE in Pennsylvania Scholarship for attendance at a public institution 12 13 of higher education shall be pro rata reduced.

14 § 6713. Eligibility requirements at private institutions of 15 higher education.

16 (a) Freshman students.--To be eligible for a HOPE in 17 Pennsylvania Scholarship, a freshman student entering and 18 seeking an associate or baccalaureate degree at an eligible 19 private institution of higher education shall meet:

20 (1) Residency requirements by satisfying the
21 qualifications for higher education grant domicile as
22 promulgated by the agency.

23 (2) Achievement standards by meeting the following24 criteria:

(i) graduating from an eligible high school with an
average cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0;
or

(ii) in the case of a student who is otherwisequalified but:

30 (A) did not graduate from high school or 20050S0026B0018 - 11 - complete a home study program and having received a general educational development equivalency diploma; or

4 (B) completed a home study program that meets the requirements of section 1327.1 of the act of 5 March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public 6 School Code of 1949, in lieu of graduating from an 7 eligible high school, earning a cumulative grade 8 point average of at least 3.0 at an eligible 9 institution of higher education at the end of the 10 quarter or semester in which the student has 11 attempted 45 guarter hours or 30 semester hours. 12 13 (3) Enrollment standards by:

14 (i) Being admitted, enrolled and classified as an15 undergraduate student in a matriculated status.

16 (ii) Being registered for and attending classes as a
17 full-time student for 14 days or more after the last day
18 of the institution for higher education's drop and add
19 period.

20 The HOPE in Pennsylvania Scholarship for the freshman student's 21 year shall be paid at the end of the freshman year.

(b) Sophomore students.--To be eligible for a HOPE in Pennsylvania Scholarship, a sophomore student seeking an associate or baccalaureate degree at an eligible private institution of higher education shall meet:

26 (1) Residency requirements by satisfying the
27 qualifications for higher education grant domicile as
28 promulgated by the agency.

29 (2) Achievement standards by meeting the following30 criteria:

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(i) Earn a cumulative grade point average of at
 least 3.0 at an eligible private institution of higher
 education at the end of the quarter or semester in which
 the student has attempted 45 quarter hours or 30 semester
 hours.

6 (ii) Maintain satisfactory academic progress in a 7 course of study in accordance with the standards and 8 practices used for Federal Title IV programs by the 9 institution of higher education in which the student is 10 enrolled.

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(3) Enrollment standards by:

12 (i) Being admitted, enrolled and classified as an13 undergraduate student in a matriculated status.

14 (ii) Being registered for and attending classes as a
15 full-time student for 14 days or more after the last day
16 of the institution for higher education's drop and add
17 period.

18 (c) Junior students.--To be eligible for a HOPE in
19 Pennsylvania Scholarship, a junior student seeking a
20 baccalaureate degree at a public institution of higher education
21 shall meet:

(1) Residency requirements by satisfying the
qualifications for higher education grant domicile as
promulgated by the agency.

25 (2) Achievement standards by meeting the following26 criteria:

27 (i) Earn a cumulative grade point average of at
28 least 3.0 at an eligible private institution of higher
29 education at the end of the quarter or semester in which
30 the student has attempted 90 quarter hours or 60 semester
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hours.

2 (ii) Maintain satisfactory academic progress in a
3 course of study in accordance with the standards and
4 practices used for Federal Title IV programs by the
5 institution of higher education in which the student is
6 enrolled.

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(3) Enrollment standards by:

8 (i) Being admitted, enrolled and classified as an 9 undergraduate student in a matriculated status.

10 (ii) Being registered for and attending classes as a 11 full-time student for 14 days or more after the last day 12 of the institution for higher education's drop and add 13 period.

14 (d) Senior students.--To be eligible for a HOPE in 15 Pennsylvania Scholarship, a senior student seeking a 16 baccalaureate degree at a private institution of higher 17 education shall meet:

18 (1) Residency requirements by satisfying the
19 qualifications for higher education grant domicile as
20 promulgated by the agency.

21 (2) Achievement standards by meeting the following22 criteria:

(i) Earn a cumulative grade point average of at
least 3.0 at an eligible private institution of higher
education at the end of the quarter or semester in which
the student has attempted 135 quarter hours or 90
semester hours.

28 (ii) Maintain satisfactory academic progress in a 29 course of study in accordance with the standards and 30 practices used for Federal Title IV programs by the 20050S0026B0018 - 14 - institution of higher education in which the student is
 enrolled.

3 (3) Enrollment standards by:

4 (i) Being admitted, enrolled and classified as an
5 undergraduate student in a matriculated status.

6 (ii) Being registered for and attending classes as a 7 full-time student for 14 days or more after the last day 8 of the institution of higher education's drop and add 9 period.

(e) Requalification.--A student who fails to maintain a 10 11 cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 at the end of the quarter or semester in which the student has attempted 45 12 quarter hours or 30 semester hours may attend the next 45 13 quarter hours or 30 semester hours without a HOPE in 14 15 Pennsylvania Scholarship. An otherwise eligible student who 16 regains a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 at the 17 end of a quarter or semester in which the student has attempted 18 90 quarter hours or 60 semester hours may requalify for a HOPE 19 in Pennsylvania Scholarship.

20 (f) No minimum hours required.--For students eligible for a 21 HOPE in Pennsylvania Scholarship under this section, no minimum 22 number of hours of enrollment is required.

23

(g) Termination of eligibility.--

(1) Except as set out in paragraph (2), a student may
 receive a HOPE in Pennsylvania Scholarship until the first of
 these events:

27 (i) the student has earned a baccalaureate degree;28 or

29 (ii) the student has attempted at any institution of 30 higher education a total of 190 quarter hours or 127 20050S0026B0018 - 15 -

semester hours.

(2) A student enrolled in an undergraduate degree
program designed to be more than 190 quarter hours or 127
semester hours in length is eligible to receive a HOPE in
Pennsylvania Scholarship for the lesser of:

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(i) a total of 225 attempted quarter hours or 150 attempted semester hours; or

8 (ii) the number of hours required for graduation if 9 the student has a cumulative grade point average of at 10 least 3.0 after the term in which the student attempted 11 190 quarter hours or 127 semester hours.

12 (h) Amount of HOPE of Pennsylvania Scholarship. -- Subject to 13 the amounts contained in the fund, a HOPE in Pennsylvania Scholarship awarded under this section shall be not more than 14 15 \$3,000 for any academic year. In the event the amount of funding 16 in the HOPE in Pennsylvania Scholarship Fund is insufficient to 17 fund all HOPE in Pennsylvania Scholarships for students 18 attending private institutions of higher education, the amount 19 of the HOPE in Pennsylvania Scholarship for attendance at a 20 private institution of higher education shall be pro rata 21 reduced.

22 § 6714. Ineligibility for HOPE in Pennsylvania Scholarship.
23 A student shall be ineligible for a HOPE in Pennsylvania
24 Scholarship if any of the following apply:

(1) The student is not a United States citizen or a
permanent resident alien who meets the definition of an
eligible noncitizen under Federal Title IV requirements.

(2) The student has not complied with the United States
 Selective Service System requirements for registration if
 such requirements are applicable to the student.

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1 (3) The student is in default on a Federal Title IV 2 educational loan or an educational loan administered by the 3 agency, provided that a student who is otherwise not eligible 4 and has fully repaid the defaulted loan will be eligible to 5 obtain a HOPE in Pennsylvania Scholarship for future academic 6 terms but not retroactively.

7 (4) The student owes a refund on a Federal Title IV 8 student financial aid program or an educational loan 9 administered by the agency, provided that a student who is 10 otherwise not eligible and has fully repaid the defaulted 11 loan will be eligible to obtain a HOPE in Pennsylvania 12 Scholarship for future academic terms but not retroactively.

13 (5) The student has been convicted of a felony offense 14 involving marijuana, a controlled substance or a dangerous 15 drug, provided that such ineligibility extends from the date 16 of the conviction to the completion of the next academic 17 term.

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(6) The student is incarcerated.

19 (7) The student does not meet each qualification listed
20 in this chapter relating to the relevant HOPE in Pennsylvania
21 Scholarship and is applicable to the student.

22 § 6715. Use of a HOPE in Pennsylvania Scholarship.

23 A HOPE in Pennsylvania Scholarship may be applied only to 24 tuition, mandatory fees and book costs.

25 § 6716. HOPE in Pennsylvania Scholarship Fund.

26 (a) Establishment.--There is hereby established a separate
27 fund in the State Treasury to be known as the HOPE in
28 Pennsylvania Scholarship Fund.

29 (b) Administration.--The fund shall be administered by the30 Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency.

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1	(c) Funding sourceThe source of the fund shall be any	
2	moneys appropriated to the fund by the General Assembly. All	
3	interest earned by the fund and all refunds and repayments shall	
4	be credited to the fund.	
5	(d) Use of fundMoneys from the fund shall be expended by	
б	the agency as HOPE in Pennsylvania Scholarships to eligible	
7	students.

12	§ 6721. Report to the General Assembly.	
13	On or before April 1 following the effective date of this	
14	chapter and in each succeeding year in which HOPE in	
15	Pennsylvania Scholarships are awarded, the agency shall provide	
16	a report to the General Assembly regarding the implementation of	
17	this chapter.	
18	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
