- 20 NATIONAL GUARD OR AS A RESULT OF INJURY SUSTAINED IN SERVICE AS
- 21 A POLICE OFFICER, THE OFFICER'S EMPLOYER SHALL REQUEST A WAIVER
- 22 UNDER SECTION 2164(6) (RELATING TO POWERS AND DUTIES OF
- 23 COMMISSION). UPON RETURN TO SERVICE, THE COMMISSION MAY REQUIRE
- 24 A POLICE OFFICER WHO HAS BEEN GRANTED A WAIVER OF IN-SERVICE

- 28 SHALL NOT BE DECERTIFIED UNLESS, UPON RETURN TO SERVICE, THE
- 29 OFFICER FAILS TO PARTICIPATE IN SUCH IN-SERVICE TRAINING AS THE
- 30 <u>COMMISSION DEEMS APPROPRIATE.</u>
