## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Directing the Public School Employee's Retirement System (PSERS)
- 2 to conduct a study of public school retirees' loss of
- 3 purchasing power and to evaluate the economic impact of
- 4 retirement benefits paid by PSERS on the Commonwealth of
- 5 Pennsylvania.
- 6 WHEREAS, There are nearly 140,000 retired teachers,
- 7 administrators and support professionals who provided tremendous
- 8 service to the Commonwealth and its residents during the years
- 9 in which they were actively employed in the public schools of
- 10 Pennsylvania; and
- 11 WHEREAS, PSERS issued a report in August 1997 entitled "A
- 12 Report on Benefits Increases, Cost of Living Adjustments, and
- 13 Purchasing Power of Annuitants"; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Public school retirees have not received a cost-of-
- 15 living adjustment since the passage of the act of April 23, 2002
- 16 (P.L.272, No.38), entitled "An act amending Titles 24

- 1 (Education) and 71 (State Government) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, further providing for creditable
- 3 nonschool service, for election to become a Class T-D member,
- 4 for actuarial cost method and for termination of annuities;
- 5 providing for supplemental annuities commencing 2002 and 2003;
- 6 further providing for payment of benefits, for annuity reserve
- 7 account and for the definitions of 'creditable nonstate
- 8 service, ''State employee, ''State service' and 'total
- 9 accumulated deductions; providing for notice to members;
- 10 further providing for mandatory and optional membership, for
- 11 credited State service and for retention and reinstatement of
- 12 service credits; providing for election to convert school
- 13 service to State service; further providing for creditable
- 14 nonstate service, for classes of service, for contributions by
- 15 the Commonwealth and other employers and for actuarial cost
- 16 method; providing for transfer of accumulated deductions;
- 17 further providing for disability annuities; providing for
- 18 supplemental annuities commencing 2002 and 2003 and for special
- 19 supplemental postretirement adjustment of 2002; further
- 20 providing for duties of the board to advise and report to heads
- 21 of departments and members, for duties of the board to report to
- 22 the Public School Employees' Retirement Board, for rights and
- 23 duties of annuitants, for members' savings account, for State
- 24 accumulation account and for supplemental annuity account; and
- 25 making technical corrections"; and
- 26 WHEREAS, Public school retirees who retired in 1990, 1995 and
- 27 2000 have lost 20%, 15% and 9%, respectively, of their
- 28 purchasing power; and
- 29 WHEREAS, Many public school retirees have been forced to
- 30 rejoin the work force because their purchasing power has not

- 1 kept pace with inflation; therefore be it
- 2 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct PSERS to
- 3 conduct a study of public school retirees' loss of purchasing
- 4 power; and be it further
- 5 RESOLVED, That the study include an analysis of the impact of
- 6 a cost-of-living adjustment on the PSERS pension fund; and be it
- 7 further
- 8 RESOLVED, That the study include an analysis of the economic
- 9 impact of the retirement benefits paid by PSERS on the
- 10 Commonwealth and its counties; and be it further
- 11 RESOLVED, That PSERS file a report of its findings with the
- 12 Majority Leader, the Minority Leader and the chair and minority
- 13 chair of the Education Committee of the House of Representatives
- 14 no later than four months following the adoption of this
- 15 resolution.
